

<u>Doe Inc.</u>, and I spoke in a town-meeting format. We were preceded by a film depicting the three of us panelists speaking about the challenges and opportunities presented by being - and inspiring - agents of change. We spoke about changing the ways girls and women are treated both here and abroad. Craig's organization is the world's largest movement of men and boys working to end violence against women and girls.





The event was followed by a delicious reception catered by **Nancy McPherson**, chef and proprietor of <u>Nancy's Airfield Café</u> in Boxborough. With everyone inspired by Razia, at the reception, something spontaneous and wonderful happened. The Concord club offered to seek a Global Grant from <u>The Rotary Foundation</u> to provide equipment for the science, computer and writing labs of the school she founded, <u>Zabuli Education</u> Center for Girls, which is located just north of Kabul in Afghanistan.

Then the magic started. One by one, clubs joined in until at least 17 jumped on board with the Global Grant. Past District Governor **Ralph Hammond** of the Nashoba Valley club announced this opportunity, and the other clubs eagerly signed up.

We are hoping that at least three more clubs join, so that each donation may be as little as \$500. This is an ideal way for small clubs to be a part of a \$35,000 Global Grant. 
The pinning ceremony took place on January 30 during the Worcester club's weekly luncheon meeting.

D7910 Resolution Committee Conducting Annual Review

The District 7910 Resolutions Committee is conducting an annual review of the district's resolutions. Any qualified club in good standing in the district - upon vote of that club as well as the district governor, the district trustees, the district Council, or the district Resolutions Committee - may propose changes to the district resolutions in accordance with this article.

Changes may include amendments, alterations, or repeal in whole or in part of the resolutions by a majority vote of the voting delegates present at the annual District Conference.

Should your club decide to submit a proposal to the Resolutions Committee, to change the resolutions at the annual District Conference, you must:

- Be a club in D7910 in good standing;
- Submit your proposed changes in writing to the district secretary, postmarked no later than February 16, 2015; and,
- Submit a copy of your proposed changes in writing to the chair of the Resolutions Committee, postmarked no later than February 16, 2015.

Once you submit your proposal:

 The Resolutions Committee shall send to the district secretary its recommendations regarding any proposed changes no later than March 31, 2015; and,



 The district secretary shall disseminate the recommendations of the Resolutions Committee by April 15, 2015.

As always, the Resolutions Committee along with the district leadership extend to you our most heartfelt appreciation for your leadership and service to community through Rotary. Should you have any questions regarding this matter, do not hesitate to contact me.

The Inauguration Ceremony featured speakers from both the WPI club and the club's sponsor, the <u>Rotary Club of Worcester</u>. Each Rotaract club member received a pin that represents his or her commitment to <u>Rotary International's</u> "service above self" <u>mission and core values</u>.
