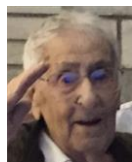

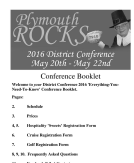

polio. The funds will build on last year's historic achievement of stopping transmission of the wild poliovirus in Nigeria and all of Africa. 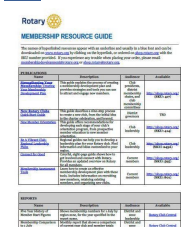

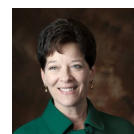
By definition, job No. 1 is to attract new members into Rotary. But really is that all? And, by the way, how? It may be that the job is much more

## Montachusett Area Rotary uses grant to support literacy



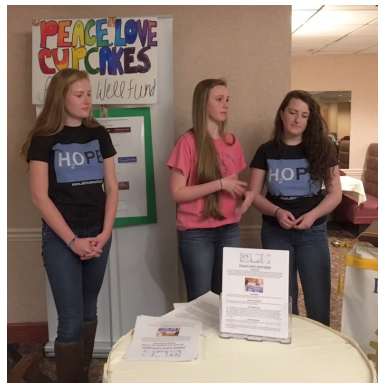

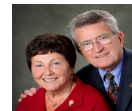


The district treasure is elected for a term of three years by the District Nominating Committee and
