May is Youth Services Month, time to celebrate **Interact & EarlyAct.** 







- Choose plants that attract bees: native wildflowers, flowering herbs, berries, many flowering fruits, vegetables and flowering trees.
- Pick plants with long bloom cycles.
- Group enough of these flowering plants together to feed many bees.
- 4. Add a sloping bird bath with stones for bees to stand on, almost any shallow water source. — Yes, they drink water.

Students learn a new language, discover another culture, and truly become global citizens. Exchanges for students ages 15-19 are sponsored by Rotary clubs in more than 100 countries. What are the benefits? Exchange students unlock their true potential to: Develop lifelong leadership skills. Learn a new language and culture. Build lasting friendships with young people from around the world. Become a global citizen. How long do exchanges last? Long-term exchanges last a full academic year, and students attend local schools and live with multiple host families. Short-term exchanges last from several days to three months and are often structured as camps, tours, or homestays that take place when school is not in session. You will receive training before you leave. This not a vacation.

This is a learning experience you'll never forget or will ever be matched in your life. Imagine living in another country, becoming familiar with that culture through your host family, your new school and the new friends you will make. While you learn about a new culture, your host family and everyone you meet will be learning about you and your country. Everything you say and do will reflect on the United States of America.
