Global Grant Application – Apply online at www.rotaryinternational.org/ on a rolling basis.

District Grants fund short term projects and activities, either local or international. Support the Foundation’s mission. Clubs submit their application to District 7950 which administers and distributes the funds.

Global Grants fund large-scale projects and activities that (1) align with an area of focus (2) respond to a need the benefitting community has identified (3) includes active participation of Rotarians in benefitting community (4) are sustainable and have measureable results.

District Grant

- Supports the mission of The Rotary Foundation – humanitarian projects
- \$1,000 - \$3,000 for total project budget
- Other funding or partner clubs required for project budgets larger than \$3K
- Short term impact
- Local or international projects – preference given to local projects
- Hands on meaningful participation of club members
- Adheres to the Grant Terms & Conditions
- Project completed by June 1. Report and receipts submitted to District prior to reimbursement of funds

Global Grant

- Supports at least one of the Six Areas of Focus
- Minimum total project budget of \$30,000
- Long term – sustainable impact
- International project – involves 2 countries or an impoverished area of US
- Active Rotarian involvement for benefitting partner
- Can support scholars pursuing graduate-level study internationally
- Adheres to the grant Terms and Conditions
- Project may take 2+ years to complete
- Funds granted after final approval by TRF
- Report due every 12 months and final report with receipts and bank statements due 2 months after completion of project.

Note: Both DG & GG projects cannot be started prior to award notification; however, plan early.

Club Qualification for ALL grants:

- At least one (preferably two) club members must attend a grant management and qualification training webinar on one of these three dates: Tuesday, February 13th, Wednesday March 14th and Thursday April 12th from 6:00-8:00PM.
- Preference to club that has contributed to The Rotary Foundation Annual Fund-SHARE in the Rotary Year 2016-2017.
- Club must not be in arrears for Rotary International or District 7950 dues as of July 31, 2018.
- Read, agree and sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) **and** a District Addendum (DA). Submit via email to gregroche@outlook.com or by mail to Greg Roche, 17 Edith Avenue, Buzzards Bay, MA02532.
