Celebrate World Immunization Week, 24-30 April

This month, from 24 - 30 April, we join WHO, UNICEF, and the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention in celebrating <u>World Immunization</u> <u>Week</u>, raising awareness of the incredible impact that vaccines have had on global health.

This year's theme is "Vaccines Work" – and they do. The proof is in our polio eradication campaign. Thirty years ago, there were an estimated 350,000 cases of polio per year worldwide. Only 37 cases of polio were recorded in 2016. As of 19 April, there have only been five. All of the other cases, and the paralysis and death they would have brought, were prevented through the widespread use of a safe, reliable, and inexpensive vaccine.

In an uncertain world, vaccines offer something remarkable: a way to protect our children throughout their lives. By working together to safeguard all children against polio and other preventable diseases, Rotary is truly *Serving Humanity* – now and for generations to come. Sincerely,

Maternal and Child Health How Can Your Club Can Help?



Women's health and infant health before, during, and after pregnancy are vital factors to the health and wellbeing of the whole family. There are opportunities in your own community where you can help. You could fund specialist equipment or set up a special programme. Here are some suggestions:

- There may be a hospital which needs a humidicrib or other specialist equipment or a facility specifically for mothers and babies
- With the help of specialist medical staff, set up or help to fund already existing programs for new mothers, teen pregnancy; contraception and STDs; drug and alcohol counselling for mothers and babies at risk; grief counselling for mothers (and their partners) who lose babies before or after delivery;

Get in touch with your local hospitals, health centres and doctors see what needs you could fill.



District 9500 VTT Opportunity For a Global Grant Introduced at the Geelong Conference March 26 2017

Scope and requirements

- A competitive bid for one VTT opportunity for a Club or group of clubs
- Must have a team of a minimum of three including, one of which must be a Rotarian
- Follow the RI definition of a VTT, be sustainable and measurable
- The District will fund up to \$10,000 USD
- Club or clubs and the international host club contribute \$2,500 USD each, (\$5,000 USD) the contribution to the Foundation allows the use of DDF for the Global Grant resulting in a dollar for dollar match
- The minimum bid for a Global Grant is \$30,000 USD
- Clubs must qualify for a Global Grant by meeting with the District Grants chair or representative for an information session
- Clubs must be regular, annual contributors to The Rotary Foundation
- Expressions of interest will be followed up by an information session at your club to explain the details and the process
- All of the forms required for the Global Grant are on the District website
- Applications should be sent to the VTT/Scholarships Team Leader for 2107/18 and be received from the 1 July until 31 December 2017
- Successful bids will be announced at the 2017/18 District Conference

From the panoramic views from the Pier in Geelong, the some 200+ conferees enjoyed and participated in three days of stimulating and challenging dialogue with an outstanding program of national speakers. The theme was Sea Change with Rotary and each speaker contributed a message for clubs to consider.

The Geelong Art Gallery was a classy venue for a Civic welcome and then the Pier Function Centre hosted the rest of the Conference.


