July was a quiet month for Interplast with just one plastic and reconstructive surgical program activity in Lautoka, Fiji. This scheduled downtime provided a valuable opportunity for us to plan ahead for the rest of the financial year.

Thanks to a small increase in our funding from the Australian Government and ongoing donations from individuals, Rotary and corporate supporters, Interplast is set to again increase the number of surgical and training programs this financial year.

This is part of an ongoing growth in our programs that increases impact for local communities throughout the region, from 58 programs in 2014–15, to 66 in 2015–16, and 81 in the past financial year. Our ability to respond to increased requests from our local partners is only possible with your ongoing support.
