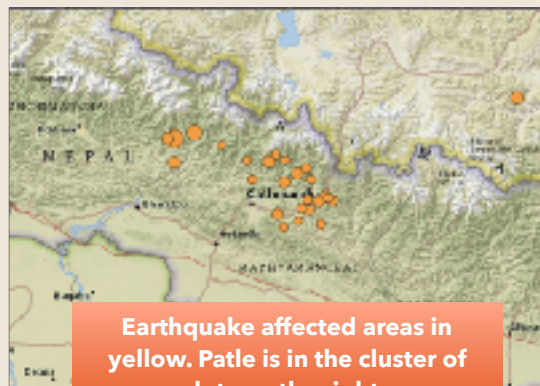

This program will be run for us by the well respected organization REED Nepal (Rural Education and Environment Development) which has been running such programs in Nepal for over ten years.



GLOBAL GRANT



The Rotary Club of Stuart has partnered with the Rotary Club of Madhyapur in Kathmandu to apply for a Global Grant to rebuild the small primary school in the village of Patle, a days' walk from Okhaldhunga, about half way between Kathmandu and the Everest region.

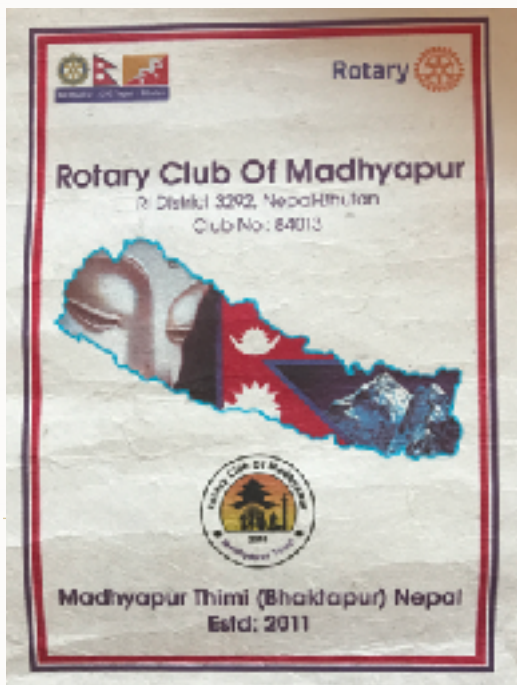

REBUILDING A SCHOOL

IMPROVING LITERACY IN RURAL NEPAL

Stuart Rotary Club has undertaken to not just rebuild a school in a remote village, but also to raise the standard of literacy in the whole valley involving the surrounding villages and teachers.



BROKEN DOWN SCHOOL: APRIL 2015

Since the earthquake when the small two classroom school of Patle, housing about forty young students and three teachers, became totally unsafe, the community banded together to build a temporary school of plastic sheeting and rough hewn wood with a mud floor. This has been their classroom ever since.



PLANNED REBUILD: 2018

Our Global Grant will be enough to provide a new comfortable weatherproof school including a boys and girls toilet. This will encourage regular attendance of both boys and girls. The skills learned by the local community involved in the rebuild can also be used to help rebuild their own houses.



TEACHER TRAINING: 2018

Teacher training was a recognized need in Nepal ever since Sir Edmund Hillary started building schools in the Everest region. His friend Jim Strang initiated a program which has since become the well recognized organization REED Nepal www.reednepal.org. The Australian Himalayan Foundation uses REED to facilitate its flagship TTQ program of teacher training, and since the earthquake to design and rebuild 58 schools.
