



The Sir Charles Bright Scholarship Trust - providing \$2000 Scholarships to University and TAFE students with disability

The Trust, founded in 1984, in memory of Supreme Court Judge Sir Charles Bright, has assisted over four hundred students since being established in Adelaide by blind lawyer Malcolm Penn OAM and Rosemary Penn OAM. Sir Charles' numerous contributions to our society included Chancellor of Flinders University, Chairman of Minda Homes, Executive member of the World Association of Judges and a member of the Enquiry which led to the creation of the SA Health Commission. Scholarship funds awarded now total around \$400,000.

Scholarships are awarded to students with disability undertaking education at University, TAFE or other recognised post-secondary institutions. Applications made during October through January are considered by the Board and detailed interviews follow during February.

Applicants can apply through the various tertiary institutions' Disability Services and / or by requesting an application form through email: scbscholarship@gmail.com. Students who come from country areas are encouraged to lodge applications and can be interviewed by telephone.

Certificates and cheques are presented at a reception at Adelaide University late February by a Minister of the State Government. Trustees receive heartfelt feedback from students as they progress in their chosen fields and begin to realise their full potential.
