Hello again Readers.

Last week's edition was a bumper at 13 pages and this week's edition compares handsomely.

Well, my comments on "cheque donations" to other charities did spark conversation – as I predicted.

Unfortunately, some have misunderstood my point or I wasn't clear in how I presented my observation. Of course we at district level (and at RI) are grateful for the contributions made to the Rotary Foundation by Clubs (and individuals). I was in no way diminishing such efforts and after all, this is where our District Grants money comes from. My comment was intended to create thought on what the Club does with its hard earnt money. Sure, local charities are important, especially in non-metro communities - remember, I am from a 'country' Club. But make sure that when you hand over that cheque, that Rotary and your Club is acknowledged so that the public are aware of how You assisted that group in their community works. Rotary and Rotarians have in the past, been quite poor at self-promotion — blowing our trumpet and this I believe is a contributing factor to our overall declining membership. Giving money to another organisation for their good works, whilst commendable, doesn't do us any public recognition favours, unless Rotary is

recognised in those good works. Consider discussing with that "group" an opportunity for a joint venture where both groups get public kudos for the good works. The more that Rotary's name is associated with community good works, the more people that will want to be a part of Us - Rotary.

If you'd like to see first-hand the good works done throughout our District and D9520, then come along to the conference – 23-25 March. Many of the presentations are Rotary centric (tie into Rotary in some way) and of course there's the Showcase marquee. Yes, a marquee – that's how many clubs and groups want to show you what they are up to. Come along, have a look at what the Districts are up to and meet some great folk while you're at it. Accommodation is still available, the Barossa is a beautiful place and bookings are still reasonably priced.







RYPEN (Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment) is an annual three-day residential for 14-17 year old. Rotary Clubs across the District sponsor each participant and the program is facilitated by an energetic group of young leaders. RYPEN develops and empowers participants through a focus on building valuable leadership skills.

Guest speakers and youth team leaders inspire awardees on topics like self-belief, working in teams, managing conflict, public speaking and goal setting. The event also allows networking between a diverse range of like-minded youth.

# **Passing of a Rotary Benefactor**

Mrs. Shirley Ellis passed away on Mon. 22<sup>nd</sup> Jan. Mrs. Ellis' husband Stan (a member of Woodville South Rotary Club at the time) instigated the use of a large shed for the Toy Boys (now Charles Sturt Grange Rotary) and in 2001 offered an adjoining shed to the Rotary Club of Largs Bay for their Wheelchair Restoration Project. So even after his death the legacy continued under the patronage of Mrs. Ellis.

Our Club awarded Mrs. Ellis a Paul Harris Fellow Sapphire in 2016 (she had previously received a PHF from Charles Sturt Grange.)

We are unsure about the future regarding the buildings availability, but never the less the contribution of more than 17 years of the premises has been an enormous contribution to Rotary.
