ARE YOU THE NEXT ROMAC OPERATIONS DIRECTOR?

Position vacant

Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children (ROMAC) requires a self-motivated Rotarian to fill the role of Operations Director.

The position requires the Rotarian to become a Director of ROMAC entities and take overall responsibility (together with the ROMAC Operations Manager), for all operational matters pertaining to the processing of referrals through to the safe return, after treatment, of the ROMAC Patient and their Carer.

To be a successful in this role a candidate will require the following attributes:

- 1. Proven organisational skills
- 2. Experience in negotiations at a high level. Experience within the medical and health delivery areas, and other State and Federal government departments, would be beneficial.
- 3. Confident in their computer skills and demonstrable skills in this area are essential.
- 4. The Operations Director requires a personality and an ability to accommodate different cultures and encourage volunteers to work as a team.
- 5. The Operations Director also requires a big heart and be prepared to be one of the key persons to enable ROMAC to fulfil its Mission; that of providing specialist treatment for children from developing countries, in the form of life saving and/or dignity restoring surgery not accessible to them in their home country

Kula Spirit

The Kula Spirit is a private boat clinic (licence number 0201) that delivers health services to rural communities in Milne Bay Province of PNG (MBP) through Rotary and Spacim Pikinini-PNG Inc (SP), a registered NGO, not-for-profit charity focused on maternal health and family planning. The Kula Spirit has been operating in Milne Bay since 2015 providing much needed medical supplies, equipment, contraceptive implants, support, training and capacity building for health facilities. Partnering with the Milne Bay Provincial Health Authority (MBPHA), St Barnabas School of Nursing, PNGATSA, UPNG and church health agencies, the Kula Spirit has conducted a number of successful outreach programs across the province. Since 2013, SP has provided some 60,000 family planning implants, giving women the right to choose and preventing an estimated 90,000 pregnancies.

Objectives:

- To reduce maternal mortality in Milne Bay; and
- To increase under five survival rates in Milne Bay.



Needs

In order to expand our work and achieve our objective to improve maternal health outcomes in Milne Bay, we need support. In particular, we face an immediate funding need to cover repairs and maintenance of the Kula Spirit in order to keep her sea worthy. Initially, we need immediate funding of some AUD30,000 to cover this maintenance work load (rebuild of engine). Any form of financial support or donations would be greatly appreciated and allow us to strengthen struggling health facilities and meet the needs of rural communities.

We can host 12 travellers single or a couple. Depending on interest in terms of a return visit to you, we plan on sending the same number to your District.

We prefer to host for approximately 14 days, including days of arrival and departure, and will appreciate it if you can accommodate us for the same number of days.

D9400 covers the following countries, Botswana, Swaziland, Mozambique and the following provinces in South Africa – Gauteng, Limpopo, North West and Mpumalanga. You can easily be hosted in 2 of the 4 Countries but incorporating 3 or more might prove to be too much as travelling between the Countries over a 14 day period means covering quite a distance with added flights.

Due to the above we have tailor-made packages ranging between Platinum, Gold and Silver that will help you make a decision. Please note the Platinum and Gold packages will have an added financial implication for inbound guests to D9400. 
