Rotary Down Under 2018 Board Elections

In accordance with Clause 17 of the Rotary Down Under Incorporated Constitution, we draw your attention to the need for election of a Past Officer of Rotary International to serve on the Board of Directors of Rotary Down Under Incorporated and RDU Pty Limited for a period of three years, commencing 1 July 2018. The successful Past Officer will represent Rotary Down Under Group 5 (comprising Rotary International Districts 9500 and 9520). The term will conclude on 30 June 2021.

The retiring Board member for Group 5, PDG Euan Miller, has served just one three-year term and is therefore eligible for re-election in accordance with Clause 16.2 of the said Constitution.

Accordingly, we call for nominations from RI Past Officers within Districts 9500 and 9520 for the position of representative for Group 5 – for the three-year period from July 2018 to June 2021."

Request from RYE Chairman

With only a few weeks remaining before our district committee has to finalise our inbound students I am seeking last minute support from our clubs.

As a district we have to receive as many students from overseas as we send. This is a government rule.

In line with this we have agreed to accept 5 for the 2018/19 year and I have their names and details etc.

However, with little time remaining I can only place 3 students into clubs in 9500 district.

I am now trying to place the remaining 2 students in a sharing capacity, ie with 2 clubs sharing the student 6 month's each. This means a club would have access to the student for the last half of 2018 or for the first half of 2019. The club would have to find only one or two host families, as well as a counsellor. This reduces the cost and host issues for clubs dramatically.

At this time such arrangements could be a city/country share or even country region/region share.

The matter is of great urgency and I need to inform our students within 2/3 weeks if they are able to come to South Australia.

District Selection Day for potential students going on Exchange in 2019

The District Committee for Rotary Youth Exchange has organised the District Selections to occur on Sunday 6th May at Xavier College in Gawler.

The Selection program will run across the day and student applicants and their families and Club Counsellors will be advised of the times for their attendance prior to the day.

At this stage the committee are aware that many clubs are currently processing student Expressions of Interest with the potential of being given club sponsorship, and they ask those clubs involved to try to have this finalised over the next few weeks. Clubs are asked to send to the Chairman, Ian Howlett an email or letter indicating that their club is supporting their student and naming the Club Counsellor. This email or letter should also contain the contact details of the student, their family and the Counsellor.

Whilst late entrants are possible to add to the list of Out-bound students, it is best that the committee get the details prior to Selection Day on May 6th.

The Committee are still organising host clubs for the July group of overseas students and are seeking club interest. They would like to point out that due to our Rotary and Education Dept guidelines, the number of students we send on overseas exchange out must equal the number we host back here in our district.
