'A Report on the Membership Summit Held at Henley Beach on Sat. 6 August 2016 and attended by 52 members from 27 (out of 44) clubs in our District. Clubs from Alice Springs, Clare, Northern Yorke Peninsula, Port Pirie, Roxby Downs and Whyalla were represented. Let me be 'up front' and say that I dragged myself away from BBQ hotplate duties at Modbury to attend as single representative of our club as a duty rather than particular expectation. How wrong can you be! It was probably, minute for minute, the most beneficial Rotary session that I've attended in 34 years of membership. It was a balanced and crafted three hour, session of keynote presentation and opportunity for individual input on the critically important of membership in our organisation. The enthusiasm of the younger Rotarians attending was particularly encouraging. And by younger I mean all the other attendees apart from me! And it was free! If you missed it – and most of you did – don't feel out of the loop because the organising committee provided a representative of each represented club with a USB containing a number of relevant topics of relevance to membership growth and maintenance. An Extract from RC Modbury's News Letter – Rotary's Initial Response to a Local Disaster For many years the District Disaster Recovery Committee has operated under a Memorandum of Understanding with the Department of Housing SA to provide coordination services in the waiting area of a Recovery Centre set up in the event of a local disaster.

Exercise Stuffed Goose commenced on <u>19 November 2007</u>, and involved a week of Emergency Management training exercises in the Adelaide Hills and Murray Bridge, using a bushfire scenario. Many government departments and voluntary agencies were enabled to exercise and integrate their plans in readiness for the real thing.

The exercise placed Monarto Zoo and Mobilong Prison under threat, damaged the River Murray Pumping Station, burned approximately 200 houses, and affected pig and poultry farms and the abattoirs. The Recovery Centre Exercise for Families SA and its participating agencies was conducted on Thursday 22 November and about 150 people, including a dozen Rotarians from Districts 9500 and 9520, one of whom was Keith, took part on the day. From a Rotary viewpoint the exercise had the objective of ensuring the effective management of "people flow" coordination in a Recovery Centre. More recently, during January 2015, a number of our members were able to provide friendly greeting and marshalling services to victims of the Sampson Flat bushfires at the Recovery Centre at Golden Grove. Which leads me into the following invitation –just received. All day training from 9.00am to 4.00pm is being provided to interested Rotarians at a number of locations in Adelaide suburbs and regional centres. The local session is scheduled for Housing SA
