'Can you hear me?' scam

Australians who receive a phone call that starts with the words "can you hear me?" are being warned to hang up immediately without saying anything.

Police say it is a scam, which has done the rounds in the United States and United Kingdom.

The intention of the call is to record "yes" responses to authorise payments using voice recognition software.

"If the scammer already has your mobile phone number and some sensitive identification information of yours... you may have some serious and legitimate reasons to be concerned," Queensland police said.

Australians are being asked to help spread the word about the scam, and contact police if they have any information.

They advise people who receive a "can you hear me?" phone call to hang up.

If they have responded with a "yes", Australians are advised to alert their financial institutions and to monitor their accounts closely.

Foundation Fundraiser - Alice Springs



Our club recently submitted acquittals for two Rotary Foundation District Grants which included the Preventable Blindness Testing & Diagnosis Project.

Our club presented Dr Tim Henderson, Eye Specialist and Director of Ophthalmology at Alice Springs Hospital with a portable digital visual acuity system which utilised over 20 tests to assist in the diagnosis of various eye diseases. Its portability and functionality in various light conditions makes it ideal for use both in the Alice Springs eye clinic and in remote communities.

This project made the Centralian Advocate on 16 December 2017 and was reprinted in the ROTIAC on 7 January 2017.

In March alone, Dr Henderson and the eye health team visited four remote Indigenous communities, diagnosing and treating 36 patients suffering from significant eye-health issues. During 2017, the eye health team plan to make a further 28 visits to remote communities across a region that covers over 873,292 square kilometres - an area roughly the size of France and the United Kingdom combined. In addition to the regular examinations which occur at the eye clinic in Alice Springs Hospital, this will result in approximately 300 people from remote Indigenous communities being diagnosed and treated this year.

To demonstrate the Alice Springs Hospital's appreciation for our assistance in this project, Dr Tim Henderson has agreed to speak at a Rotary Foundation Fundraiser our club has organised on Wednesday 24 May 2017.

District 9500 VTT OpportunityFor a Global Grantas Introduced at the Geelong

Conference - March 26, 2017

Scope and requirements

- A competitive bid for one VTT opportunity for a Club or group of clubs
- Must have a team of a minimum of three including, one of which must be a Rotarian
- Follow the RI definition of a VTT, be sustainable and measurable
- The District will fund up to \$10,000 USD
- Club or clubs and the international host club contribute \$2,500 USD each, (\$5,000 USD) the
 contribution to the Foundation allows the use of DDF for the Global Grant resulting in a dollar for
 dollar match
- The minimum bid for a Global Grant is \$30,000 USD
- Clubs must qualify for a Global Grant by meeting with the District Grants chair or representative for an information session
- Clubs must be regular, annual contributors to The Rotary Foundation
- Expressions of interest will be followed up by an information session at your club to explain the details and the process
- All of the forms required for the Global Grant are on the District website
- Applications should be sent to the VTT/Scholarships Team Leader for 2107/18 and be received from the 1July until 31 December 2017
- Successful bids will be announced at the 2017/18 District Conference

Dear President

Congratulations on what I am sure has been a wonderful year leading your Rotary Club. I am sure there have been challenges, as well as the rewards of providing support to your community, local, national and international.

I have had the same experiences with ShelterBox Australia.
