In a recent operation by IJM and the Ghanaian authorities, 24 young boys were rescued from slavery working as fisher boys on Lake Volta. In this region of Ghana, traffickers prey on poor families who are persuaded to send their children to work in deplorable conditions on rickety fishing boats. Parents are hoodwinked into believing that their children will attend school in exchange for a few hours of work. In reality, children work 14 hour shifts with one meal a day.

In performing this act of community servicethe fledgling Rotary Club of Chicago was transformed into the world's first Service Club.

The idea for the project came about whenthe Rotarians, all local businessmen, decided that if downtown Chicago had public toilet facilities then shoppers would be more inclined to stay in the shopping district longer, thus enhancing business. The Committee are now looking for clubs that can act as hosts for the next group of students. We would like to offer a similar number of students from European countries the same cultural and educational experience but we need your help with the hosting. I am aware that many schools have staff employed as International coordinators and that they are often too happy to help search out and supply us with additional families that are willing to host these children but the contact has to be made by our clubs initially. If you have a Youth or New Generation Director then they would be the ideal person to start such contact. Host family's do not have to be Rotarians, nor do they need to have children in them. In fact the students enjoy a few weeks in the company of mixed ages. They do have to possess Police Checks through the DCSI system but these have become quicker to obtain as of late.

The District committee is only too happy to help all clubs find out more about the benefits and demands our great Rotary Youth Exchange Program as well as to speak to your members on it.
