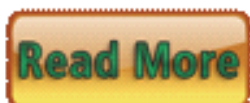

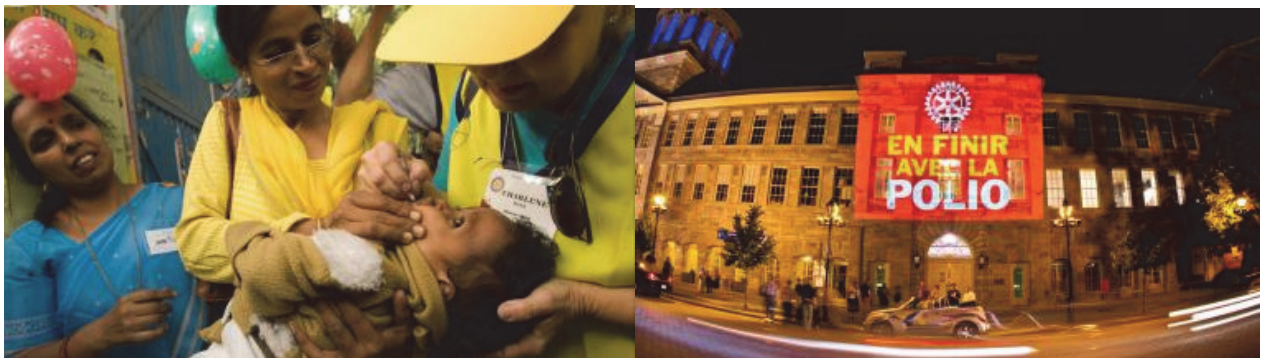
Publicise your events
