

WHY DONATE TO THE ROTARY FOUNDATION - OUR FOUNDATION

On 31 July I had the privilege of Presenting a **Rotary Foundation Major Donor Award to Brian Condon OAM**and Past President of the Rotary
Club of Port Pirie.



This recognition was acknowledging ongoing personal contributions to the Rotary

Foundation.

When responding, Brian told us why he donates to the Rotary Foundation. As a young boy in Port Pirie, on a Saturday, Brian and a few friends rode their push bikes to Cockeys Crossing - about a half day ride there and another half day ride home along the dirt track. Brian carried his friend - Georgie Shearer - on the bar of his bike. They arrived home exhausted late that afternoon. On the Monday evening, a policeman called at the Condon home and asked if Brian had been with Georgie Shearer on Saturday and of course the answer was yes. The policeman went on to say that Georgie was taken ill on the Saturday night, and was transported from Pt Pirie to Adelaide by Ambulance and sadly died on the Monday.

The cause of Georgie's death was Polio. How quickly it took the life of a young boy who was fit and well on Saturday, but dead on Monday. Such was the extent of polio at that time, that schools across the state were closed for 5 months in an attempt to curb the spread of

the disease. This event has had a lasting impression on Brian, so when Past Rotary International President Clem Renouf from Queensland had the big vision and showed the leadership to call the world to account to remove this debilitating disease from the globe, Brian stepped on board and commenced personal contributions to the END POLIO campaign. We thank Brian for taking this initiative and to all Rotarians who decide that The Rotary Foundation is the Charity to receive their personal donations.

SPEAKING OF THE END POLIO CAMPAIGN

We all know that we are close to eradicating Polio from the world. But completing the war will **not** be easy, nor cheap. But we must finish the job.

In the lead up to the International Convention in Sydney, the operators of the Sydney Bridge Climb donated ½ of the climb cost to the END POLIO campaign - that was sufficient to immunize 240000 children.

Clubs are being asked to donate at least \$1500 to the END POLIO campaign and I recommend that by making early donations in the 2014 / 15 year, we can expect our money to gain the generous \$2 for \$1 subsidy from the Gates Foundation. That changes \$1500 to \$4500. Now to me, this is a very good return on our dollar.

I am heartened with the response from Clubs that have already made this payment or committed to this payment at this early stage of the year.

SOLES4SOULS Julie Campbell – District Governor's Partner Project



During this 2014-2015 year, as the District Governor's partner, I will be supporting Soles4Souls http://soles4souls.com.au and I hope to involve all clubs in this shoe collection project when I visit.

Soles4Souls collects gently used or new shoes for children, men and women in need, both in Australia and abroad, who are disadvantaged because they do not own shoes or have inadequate footwear.

On our official visit to clubs I am requesting that Rotarians bring along shoes (business / casual / sandals / sports / walking/ thongs – no heels higher than 2 inches and no ugg boots) plus a gold coin donation for each pair. I will provide a collection bag and a collection jar and take the shoes with me.

This I believe is a great project for you to involve your families, work mates and wider community

My aim this year is to collect 8,500 pairs of shoes which together with an equivalent number of gold coins for each pair will enable Rotary to fully fund a shipping container of shoes to Tanzania.

I thank the Rotary Clubs of Adelaide, Clare, Port Lincoln, Port Pirie and Salisbury for their enthusiastic uptake of this project and generous donations to date. Port Pirie Club even donated their weekly fines for the month of July to this cause.
