We want to thank everyone for the immense support all have given to their communities over the past few very trying months. Looking forward now to having some fun with events like The Million Dollar Dinner and Conference.

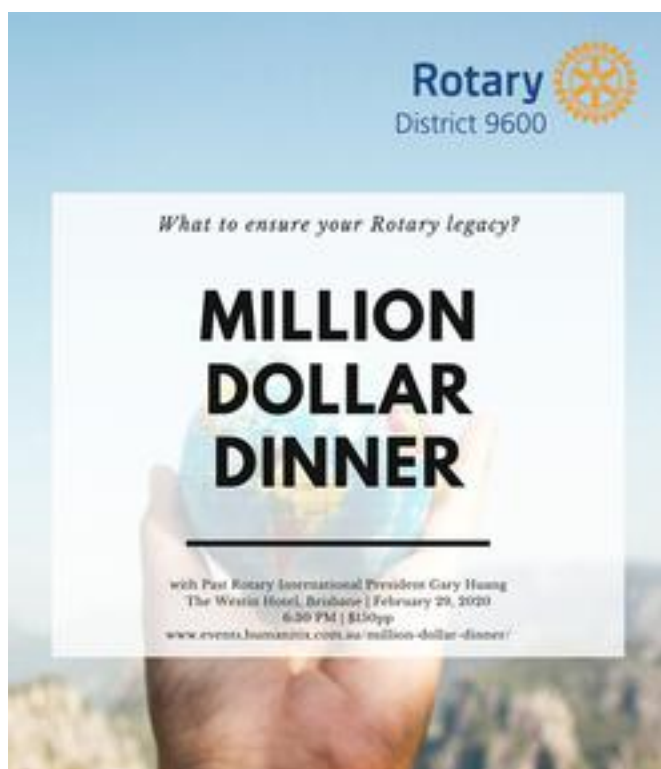

The Rotary Foundation well is our Endowment, of course. We are building a very deep, strong well that will ensure funding for major projects for generations to come. A strong endowment will ensure the long-term financial stability of our Foundation and provide essential resources to help deliver even more outstanding humanitarian service into the future.

We are aiming high with the Building TRF Endowment: 2025 by 2025 initiative to build an endowment of \$2.025 billion by 2025. By then we expect the Foundation's Endowment to have a minimum of \$1 billion in net assets, with the balance in expectancies and bequest-type commitments.

Imagine the good we will be able to do with a \$2 billion Endowment! The investment earnings will provide about \$100 million annually for Rotarians to do all sorts of life-changing projects around the globe, year after year.

Together, we can make this happen. As much as the world changes around us, the well of The Rotary Foundation will stand the test of time and keep making a positive impact on the world.

Letter of thanks received from one of the many who have received help through the RAWCS QUEENSLAND BUSHFIRE APPEAL.

Thank you for your financial support given to us from the Q'ld Bushfire Relief Fund following our disastrous fire on the 9th November, 2019 in the Bungundarra area, where we lost over 1000 fruit producing trees. The lychee trees were about 14 years old and were just recovering from Cyclone Marica, which came through on the 19th February, 2015.

All our lychee trees had protective nets over them to protect the fruit from the bats and the birds and we were ready to start picking in early December. The orchard was totally destroyed in a matter of minutes. The financial support given to us is very much appreciated. We thank the Rotary Clubs of 9600 for their unwavering support.

We also thank, our Rotary Club of Rockhampton North and the Rotaryanne's of Rockhampton North for their unwavering support. The working teams who helped us chain saw 1000 trees and chip them, and then paint the tree stumps so to avoid sunburn. The Club's kindness, friendships was a great moral and support to both Jack and myself. We are now busy preparing the area for replanting.

We Owe It To Our Farmers

The drought isn't over once it rains.

The rain has started and more will be needed. The dams are not yet full. Recovery only occurs when the farms and towns are restocked to pre-drought levels. When bank accounts start to see a net cash inflow and drought debt is paid off. It will only be over when individuals no longer suffer the mental and physical stress that comes from drought. Only when they get a sense that they can get through and see a better future, then the drought is over. This recovery is not short term, it is 5 to 10 years in the future.

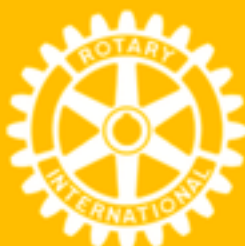

NYSF

Update

- In January there were to be three sessions of NYSF, Session B in Brisbane and Sessions A & C in Canberra.
- Session B from all reports was a great success and thank you to all concerned in particular District Liaison Tino Babao. The only disappointing item to note is again we had insufficient people (with blue cards etc) available to host even 50% of the students on the Sunday of the middle weekend to enable these students a break from campus life.
- Session A in Canberra was cancelled a couple of days in due to health risks of the Canberra Bushfires and Session C was cancelled before any students were on their way to the Session.
- This has left all of our District Candidates unable to complete their NYSF experience and a lot of questions as to what next.
- On behalf of our clubs and candidates, I, like my District Governor Classmates in Australia have been having many conversations as to what next. We are aiming to get the best results for all. NYSF is not a Rotary Project and is its own self Incorporated Body so we can only influence their decision by using our collective force to ensure that Rotary Clubs and their participants are treated fairly.
- We know for many clubs who received grants for student placements that those donors are requesting refunds as the money did not achieve what the grant was for. For Federal Government Funding, NYSF are making pleas on your behalf.
- At the end of the day we are asking for all clubs to be refunded in full by NYSF and if clubs wish to donate funds back to NYSF then that is a decision for the clubs. This will be a battle. NYSF have sufficient reserves that will allow this to happen, though it may curtail future operations.
- Applications for next year open 1 March however until the 2020 Sessions are clarified we will not be pursuing applications.
- Please keep in contact with your students to keep them informed and to know what is being sent directly to them.
- If any individual or clubs wants to make a submission on their thoughts, please send to me to collate on your District's behalf.
- This unfortunately will not be resolved in the next month or two.



Important Messages for all Clubs

- District Dues have been waived as a Club expense from January to June 2020, as these are being paid from the Reserves. However, we ask all Clubs to continue to charge Club Dues because this is an exception that will not continue into the future. We ask Clubs to make the best use of these savings, including subsidising members to attend the Annual District Conference if needed. Be reminded that the Club Dues for July to December still need to be paid if still outstanding.

Struggle Street

Rotary Making a Difference by OAM Noel Trevaskis

Three weeks ago I came home after my Rotary Club meeting and watched the show Struggle Street on SBS. My first thoughts were that Rotary can make a difference to this family, the Zaric family of Nangus. The episode of Struggle Street that featured the Zaric Family was (Season 3, Episode 4). This episode is still available to view through SBS on Demand.

An application was made for a grant from the Dick Smith Foundation through RAWCS for \$15,000 and it was successful. To make this grant a reality we need to match it with \$15,000.

Ricky and Peta Zaric live in Nangus, New South Wales (about 30km by road west of Gundagai). They have twins, Bree and Cody. Cody has some severe medical conditions requiring travel to Sydney and Canberra on a regular basis for ongoing treatment. His disease is Dent 1. This is very rare disease with only 250 people worldwide being diagnosed with Dent 1. His family is struggling financially and emotionally because of medical and travel costs. Complicating his disease is that Cody has a mutation of a gene called RANBP2. Medically they don't know what this means for Cody because this particular mutation has not been seen before. Cody is a high risk of any infection which could cause encephalitis.

They have not had a holiday since the birth of the twins five years ago. They are unable to use babysitters because of Cody's medical condition. Cody's father Ricky has to travel away for work which puts another strain on the family. They have a transportable home that they purchased but don't have the funds to fix it up. They are currently living in a "donger" on their property at Nangus.

Ricky and Peta are under considerable stress and anxiety because of the financial burden on their family and continually worry about how they can afford basic items, let alone the ongoing medical treatment for Cody. The Rotary Clubs of Districts 9700 and 9710 are collaborating to provide assistance to the family, firstly by renovating their transportable home. A builder has already made an assessment of the project which has been costed at \$38,000. This amount will ensure the cost of all materials/appliances needed will be met. Volunteers are being arranged to carry out the building, fitting and painting work.

As stated earlier a \$15,000 Rotary Grant has been secured through a Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) project but this money is only available on a dollar for dollar basis to match other donations. Donations made to the RAWCS project 44-2029-20 established to assist the Zaric family are tax deductible through the Rotary Australia Benevolent Society (RABS) which is managed by RAWCS.

We are aiming to raise \$25,000 through donations to ensure the work can be completed. Anything raised over and above that will firstly be put towards a much needed holiday for the Zaric family at the South Coast and then towards the ongoing medical costs for Cody. Please join me and making a difference to the lives of the Zaric Family by donating whatever you can. Your contribution will be tax deductible and a receipt will be sent by return e-mail.
