

RAWCS Project 29/2018-19 RCs Berwick & Ballarat West Solomon Islands Dental Clinic [report by Noel Howard D9780 RAWCS chair]

Dr. David Goldsmith has just returned from Honiara where he oversaw the delivery of a container load of dental equipment which included eight dental chairs, stools, seven amalgamators, a compressor and miscellaneous dental supplies.

The Solomon Islands has a population of 625,000 people spread over 900 islands and is one of the poorest nations on earth,. The Solomon Islands GDP is rated 173rd out of 185 countries. There is a high incidence of tooth decay and oral cancer with very few public facilities available for treatment. The Public Dental Clinic is located at the Police Station in Honiara where about 100 patients turn up each morning, of which only about 30 are able to be treated. The only other public dental facility is located at the National Referral Hospital in Honiara whose dental clinic was demolished in 2012.

There are however about 40 qualified dentists in the Solomon Islands with another 15 students about to qualify in Fiji and PNG, but due to government inertia there are limited places for them to work. *(end of report)*

The first stage, just completed by this Rotary team, involved the delivery of 9 chairs to the building, the initial installation of the chairs in 3 surgeries and transporting the other 6 chairs to other rooms in the building. As a result of the visit three rooms in the new building now have fully working operating chair/units. Additional training was given to the hospital BioMedical engineer in dental installation and maintenance procedures on the visit.

This is a joint project of the combined Rotary Clubs of Ballarat West and Berwick, and the Rotary Club of Honiara. It is registered RAWCS project 29/2018-19. The dental equipment and materials came from the Royal Adelaide Dental hospital and were shipped by Adelaide dentist Rotarian Dick Milner at Rotary Donations in Kind (DIK) along with a large consignment of medical supplies for the NRH.
