Singh was born in Punjab state of India. He completed his high school education in PN Government Inter College in Ramnagar, in UP state. He earned his Engineering degree at Banaras Hindu University in Varanasi, INDIA (BHU) in 1966 and was married in 1967. After working as a Plant Manager at a refractory plant in India, Singh immigrated to USA in 1972. His wife Surinder, daughter Shashi and son Bob joined him in 1973 when he was in New York. The family moved to Pittsburgh in 1974 and Singh earned his MBA from the University of Pittsburgh in 1978.
