Mission Statement

The mission of Angel Heart Pajama Project is to provide new pajamas and books and to foster literacy development to children who are abandoned, abused, removed from homes and placed in foster care, or living in homeless shelters in the City of Tucson, South Tucson, and surrounding counties in Southern Arizona including Pima, Cochise, Yuma, Pinal, and Santa Cruz.

History

- Angel Heart Pajama Project is the vision of the late Graciela Lopez, mother of the co-founders, Maria Patterson and Marty Croissant.
- In 1963, these three Cuban-born women immigrated to the United States to escape from political, religious, and economic distress.



- During their early years adjusting to a new language and culture, Graciela always found the means to provide new pajamas and books to enrich her children's lives.
- > Today, her vision has blossomed into an esteemed nonprofit entity, Angel Heart Pajama Project.
- > "Nana" and her daughters were able to realize their dream of
- "paying it forward" by sharing with needy children the same gift that had brought them such joy and comfort when they were young.

Why Pajamas and Books are needed in southern Arizona?

AHPP primarily serves the 9,200 square miles of Pima County. In addition, AHPP provides outreach to families with children living in the Tohono O'odham Nation, Pascua Yaqui Nation, socio-economically depressed areas such as the 29th Street corridor, refugees, I-19 corridor to Nogales, and we are fortunate to fly pajamas and books to Yuma.

Why the need for Pajamas and Books?

- According to Annie E. Casey Foundation's Kids Count report, one in five Arizona children live in poverty. The report ranked Arizona as one of the worst states—46th in the nation for child well-being. Talkpoverty.org reported in 2020, a poverty rate of 18.8% for children.
- Arizona Department of Child Safety, "Child Welfare Reporting Requirements Semi-Annual Report for the Period of January,
 2021 through June 30, 2021", reported that the Child Abuse Hotline received 22,265 calls that met the statutory criteria for a DCS report.
- ➤ DCS of AZ reported over 14,000 children were in foster care in 2021.

 These children transition to foster care or shelters often with only the clothes they are wearing. (https://www.azcourts.gov/casa/Child-Welfare-Stats.aspx)

Why Pajamas and Books?

- Pajamas Represent Comfort: "New pajamas are a necessary part of promoting good health and preventing infections and disease, as well as providing psychological benefits" says Sheldon H. Cherry, MD, Clinical Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Mount Sinai School of Medicine, NYC.
- Pajamas are not an available part of the bedtime routine for all children.
- Children's pajamas are in pleasing colors and patterns and are typically designed for sleep comfort and safety.

Bedtime Is Book Time: The enjoyment and pleasure of a bedtime story before sleep is

indisputable.

➤ Bedtime reading is associated with emotional warmth, a sense of well-being, and sleep readiness, but for children in crisis, living in shelters or group homes, books, like pajamas are frequently an inaccessible luxury.

How does AHPP receive Pajamas and Books?

2013-2022 Dashboard

- > 35,000 estimated pajamas gifted (an increase of about 10,000% in our first year we gave 270 pairs of PJs)
- > 35,000 books distributed
- > 7 actively utilized Little Free Libraries with several more in process of placement
- > 86% Hispanic, 5% African American, and 9% children of color ranging in age from infant to 21 have received support
- > Dedicated volunteers collect, sort, assemble, and distribute new pajamas and books to our recipient agencies / families. Volunteers find us through Justserve.org, churches, businesses, civic and philanthropic organizations, student service learning club











> 40 local businesses, corporations, schools, churches, medical/dental groups, and non-profit organizations support our work through grant awards, drives, and donations

> 75 local non-profit organizations serving children living in foster care facilities or homeless shelters are gifted each year.

2022-2023 Goals*




- To increase the number of children served
- To increase the number of nonprofit agency distribution centers from 75 to 80 through additional funding to meet the needs of the organizations on our waiting list.
- To continue to provide books through utilizing the Free Little Libraries in needy neighborhoods on a quarterly basis.
- To provide six literacy development activities to foster care parents and adults working with needy children.
- To enhance infra-structure and find a permanent site
- To increase financial stability for sustainability (grants, donations, estate planning)
