4-Way Test: A perfect tool for harmony between ideals How do we live peacefully in a world full of diversity?

Editor's Note: The following article was submitted following a vandal's attack on the Islamic Center in Fort Collins, CO during the early-morning hours of March, 23, 2017.

The local news this weekend of the Islamic Center being vandalized highlights reprehensible behavior. I hope the person they arrested is the perpetrator and that the full force of the law descends on him.

I have served a church which was vandalized several times; I know the experience - you feel anger, fear, frustration, conflicted - especially when the local powers seem to dismiss the event and there is no resolution, so the people get away with it

So how do we handle these charged events which seem to come from differences of belief, faith, ideas, and politics? How

do we keep the cloth of America together without out it being rent asunder by the depth of hateful feelings?

I believe we need to honor each other and intentionally allow others to hold opinions that are not even similar to ours.

We need to be tolerant and mannerly, without needing to give up our position or having to stop trying to convert others to embrace our ideas.

We need to get beyond Political Correctness, so we can discuss ideas and beliefs and come to a place where we can live with each other. We need to find a resolution with our neighbors that is tolerant and gracious. And we need to realize that living in America is a messy thing where there are lots of conflicting ideas, and that's OK.

Our 4-way test goes a long way to finding that middle ground for living with our neighbor, even when we disagree on core values. Violence is not a choice, nor are threats or bullying. We should not put up with raunchy language or clearly untruthful stories and demand our news sources truly try to be neutral on reporting. False News and propaganda are also not acceptable, even if it supports your side of the argument - without truth, we are unable to find solutions.

The Islamic Center vandalism or Jewish Community Centers being threatened, or churches being vandalized or burned must end. The persons from right, left, environmental, crazy identity hate groups, you name it, we need to speak clearly to them to cut it out, it is not acceptable.

They can believe that stuff, but they can't act upon it. This is not a Democratic or Republican but an American to call people back to moral and ethical behavior. behavior that lives under the constitution and laws of our country. Speak up, and help establish an environment where we behave ourselves.
