Statement of Conduct

Rotary International, District 5440 and Cowboy Country Rotary Youth Exchange are <u>committed to creating and maintaining the</u> <u>safest possible environment for all participants</u> in Rotary activities.

To the best of their ability, Rotarians, Rotarians' partners, and other volunteers must <u>safeguard</u> the children and young people with whom they come in contact and protect them from physical, sexual, and psychological abuse.

Commitment to Youth

- All young people have the right to freedom from harassment & abuse.
- We ensure that all of our volunteers are carefully selected, trained and accept responsibility for your safety.
- We promise to respond swiftly and appropriately to all suspicions or allegations of harassment and/or abuse.
- We ensure that access to confidential information is restricted



District Authority

- Rotary requires every district to have youth protection policy and crisis management plan
- Districts are responsible for the students they host
- Each of you will be under slightly different rules
 - Depending on laws of the country



Requirements

- Training program for clubs and students
- Screening process for adults involved in program
- Processes for protection of student
- Process for investigation of allegations and record-keeping
- Rotary International Certification



Problems unique to RYE

- Cultural differences make universal definitions of sexual abuse extremely difficult to establish
- Cultural stereotyping can expose students to abuse that other students from the host culture would not be subjected to
- Fear that reported abuse may result in them being sent home



Abuse and Harassment

- Abuse and harassment happen
- No organization is invulnerable
- Rotary takes youth protection very seriously
- Any abuse or harassment is unacceptable
- Zero tolerance policy



Is it important to know the difference?

 NO – abuse or harassment are both unacceptable and must be reported



Personal Safety Code

- Remember your Rotary support network
- If you have a problem or are worried about something, always tell someone you trust about it, such as your host parent, host club counselor or host club chairperson. Don't suffer in silence!
- Remember chain of command
- You can always call any of us



Personal Safety Code

- Never carry items abroad for others.
- When you go out, plan what you would do and where you would go if you got lost or had a problem.
- Always tell someone where you are going and when you will be home.



Personal Safety Code

- Dress and behave sensibly and responsibly
- Be sensitive to local codes and customs.
- Think things through carefully before you act and do not take unnecessary risks.



If feeling threatened, you have the right to:

- Trust your instincts or feelings
- Expect privacy
- Say no to unwanted touching or affection
- Say no to an adult's inappropriate demands or requests
- Be rude or unhelpful if the situation warrants
- Run, scream, and make a scene
- Physically fight off unwanted advances
- Ask for help



What you Can Expect

- We will listen attentively
- We will stay calm & make sure you feel safe
- We will explain that we have to tell someone else
- We will not jump to conclusions or promise to take a specific action until the situation is thoroughly investigated
- We will assure you that you are not making things worse.



Parents - Signs and Symptoms of Abuse or Harassment

- Extreme activity or withdrawal
- Expressing general feelings of shame
- Fear, particularly toward certain individuals
- Declining school performance
- Eating disorders
- Insomnia
- Irritability or angry outbursts



Additional Signs

- Avoidance of people, places, and things that might remind one of an abusive incident
- Anxiety or depression
- Nightmares
- Headache, stomach or back pain
- Suicidal thoughts
- Involvement with drugs or alcohol



Investigation By District

- The District YE Chairman will be notified IMMEDIATELY.
- Responsible for ensuring that complaints are dealt with according to applicable law and the interests of the affected person are protected to the extent possible.




