

#### Direct Request - Star Valley

Encourage every Rotarian to donate \$50 to \$100 per year to the End Polio Now Campaign.

#### Combine with a major fundraiser - Estes Park

The most recent example of what we have done to support the polio plus campaign is from our 2017 Duck Race in Estes Park. We decided to add Polio Plus to our list of organizations and promoted it strongly while the district conference was in town. In the past we had decided to use our duck race to help local non profits but we broke protocol to support a very worthy world cause. We made polio plus the preferred organization by putting it at the top, no doubt sacrificing some dollars that would've went to our club, but it was worth it! #### Collection Cans - Cheyenne

Distribute cans at weekly meeting along with a presentation of how the members can use the cans to collect funds to help eradicate polio. Collect the cans three weeks later and send in the funds.

#### Sell bracelets - Cheyenne

Spike Polio Night event at a women's volleyball game. Involve the local Rotaract club to sell purple End Polio Now" bracelets at the game for \$2 and contribute the funds to the End Polio Now campaign.

#### High School Fundraiser - Cheyenne

We contact our Interact Club Chair to set up a high school fundraiser. We prepare the Interact students with a small presentation for each to give in their classrooms on the importance of immunization and how small amounts of money add up to a huge impact. We use Polio Plus piggy banks to collect the funds.

#### Purple Pins for Polio - Fort Collins

The Fort Collins Rotary clubs sponsor a purple pins for polio event which uses sponsors to raise funds for polio.

#### Facebook campaign - Laramie

Place a small ad in the local newspaper and run several prominent posts on Facebook. In each ad and post, include a link where viewers can go to make contributions.

#### Purple Pinkie Day - Lander

Similar to the Salvation Army with bell ringing each Christmas we set up tables at the front of local businesses where we have End Polio Now posters and information about polio and ask for donations. We mark peoples pinkies with purple if they want to signify their contribution.

#### Showing of the movie "Breathe" - Loveland

We have several copies of the movie Breathe which is an excellent video showing how polio affected a family and how they rose to the occasion of dealing with it along with many friends. We are asking members to have a showing of the movie with their friends to increase awareness and also to raise funds.

#### Polio Bingo - Loveland

Our Polio Bingo game, which raises polio funds by selling Bingo cards, at \$5 per card (Rotarians can buy up to 4 cards at a time) then spinning the bingo wheel and announcing the letter and number which comes up. For example, B 16. Everyone in the room who has a card with this combination stands. A question about polio is asked from the podium. Example: "Polio is transmitted through an infected person's saliva." Every standing person who thinks this answer is correct, puts his/her hand on his/her head. Everyone standing who thinks this answer is false puts his/her hand on his/her/own rump (in this case, the correct answer) and adds a token (or penny) to his/her card.. The people who answer wrongly, learn the right answer, but have to remove the token from their B16 square. We have half a dozen prizes (gift cards, money, or gift items) for the first half dozen winners who fill their cards, and everyone learns a lot about polio facts, history, etc.
