

Can You Say Peace? by Karen Katz. (2006) Henry Holt.






Ages 3-7 Grades PreK-2




Ages 4-8 Grades PreK-2




Ages 3-6 Grades PreK-1


The Peace Stick by Nidhi Misra. (2015) Castlebridge Books.




Ages 3-9 Grades PreK-3




Ages 3-9 Grades PreK-3


What Does Peace Feel Like? by Vladimir Radunsky. (2004). Atheneum Books for Young Readers.
