

## Rotary District 5790 “Global Grants”

**Purpose:** Global Grants provide clubs the opportunity to plan and execute large, long-term projects that are sustainable and measurable. They create international partnerships and align with Rotary’s Six Areas of Focus.

### **Types of activities/categories supported:**

Humanitarian projects, Scholarships for graduate-level studies and Vocational Training Teams (Teaching or Learning)

### **Step 1: Qualify and Submit grant proposal to the District Grant Committee:**

#### **Deadlines:**

- **September 1, 2020**
  - Grants to be considered for DDF awards must be posted and clearly defined on [Matchinggrants.org](http://Matchinggrants.org) with all pertinent information
  - Each club can request or designate DDF up to 25% of their APF/Share giving for the 2017-18 Rotary year on the Fundraising Analysis report. Clubs not approved by this date may be considered for the November 1, 2020, award date.
- **November 1, 2020**
  - Global Grant DDF awards will be based on available funds, the sponsoring club giving over the last three years, support/DDF designation from other 5790 clubs, and the quality of the proposed grant. Clubs not approved by this date may be considered for the February 1, 2021 award date.
- **February 1, 2021**
  - If DDF is available, a third Grants Committee review will be held after Feb 1 to consider pending or new 5790 submissions and DDF requests from other districts.

#### **Qualifications:**

- Club must be in good standing (RI & District dues, 990 reporting, finances...)
- Club cannot have any district grants open from prior years.
- Regular support of the TRF annual fund
- The President Elect plus another club member must participate in the annual Grant Certification Training provided by the District
- Clubs must have uploaded to the <http://www.matchinggrants.org> a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) **and** their most recent 990 filing to IRS prior to submission
- Performance on previous grants will be considered (on time reporting and TRF audits/issues)
- Each GG must have a minimum budget of \$30,000.
  - Each GG must include District 5790 club(s) funding equal to or greater than their DDF request.
- **Clubs must enter 13 of 25 goals in Rotary Club Central including TRF goals.**

**Step 2: Contingent on receiving approval from the District Grant Committee, you may submit your application to the Rotary Foundation for their review and approval at [grants.rotary.org](http://grants.rotary.org).**

- The Rotary Foundation typically has requirements in addition to those of the district.
- District approval of DDF for your global grant is contingent on your satisfying the RI requirements and gaining approval within 12 months.
