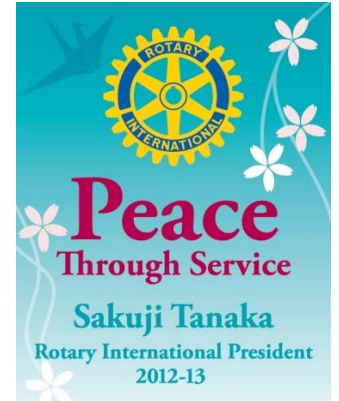

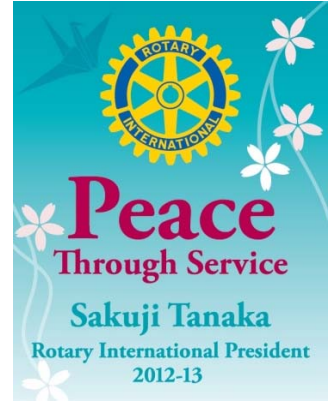

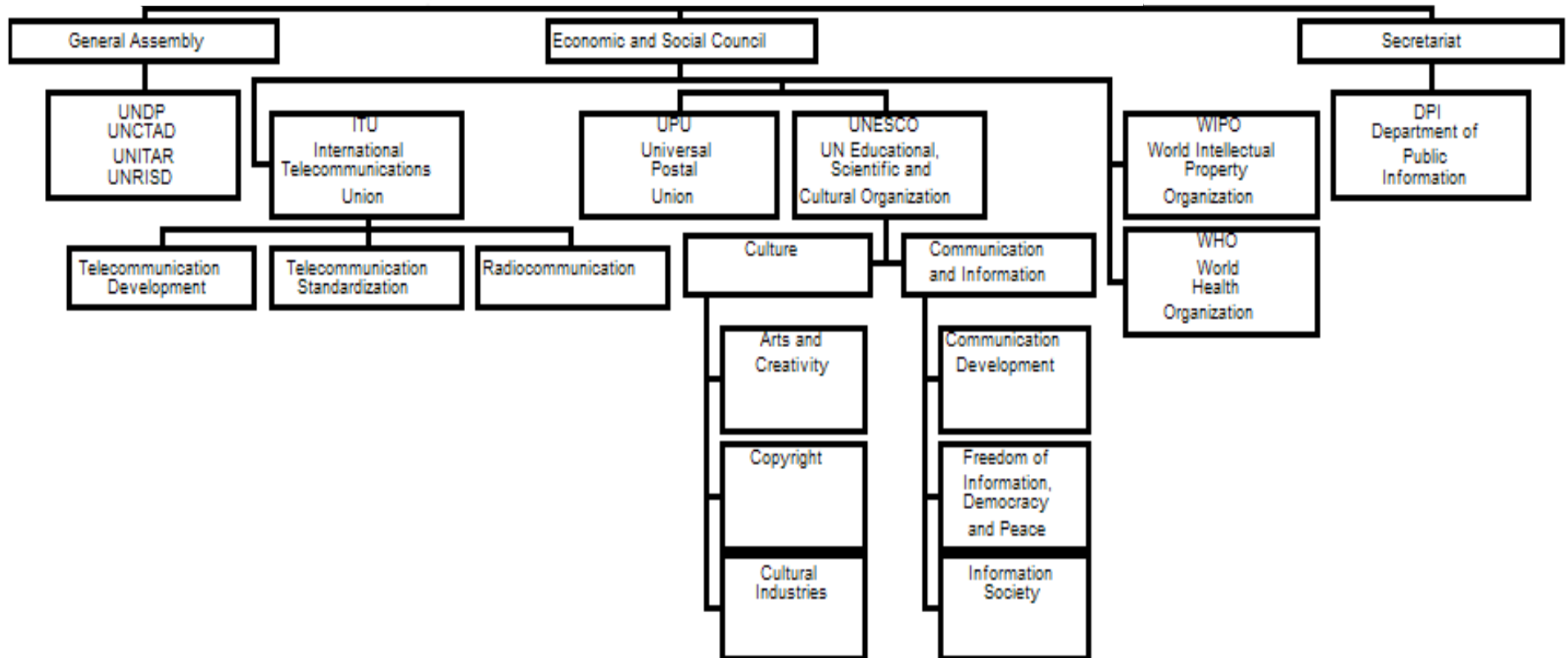

* This peace project will focus on the peace-building process.

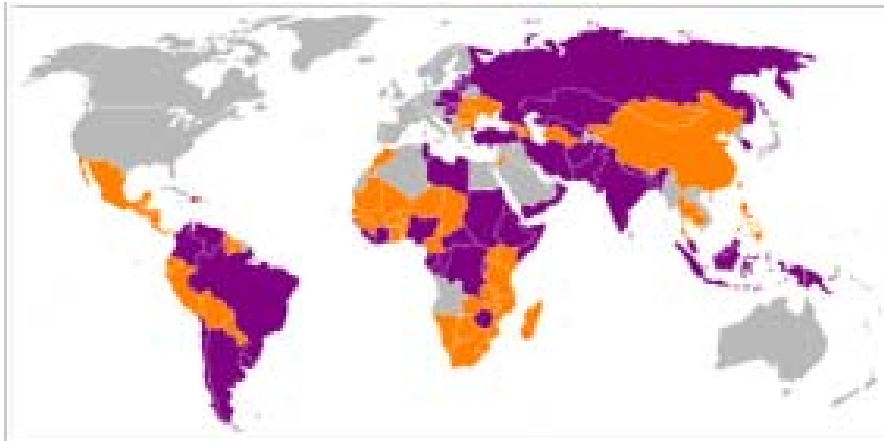

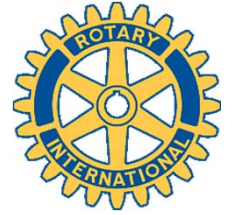

Peace: A By-Product of Rotary Projects

Tips for Communicating the Peace Message



- 1. Plan peace into the project...tag or label the product with a peace message.**
- 2. Ask the supplier to print a Rotary peace message on their product brochure.**
- 3. Ask the local Rotary Club to pursue a newspaper piece on the project, emphasizing peace and goodwill of Rotarians in the United States.**
- 4. Produce street flyers that can be distributed to the receiving country, again emphasizing peace and goodwill from members of your Rotary Club.**
- 5. Ask the local newspaper to write a series about peace, using sections from the District 5790 peace article.**
- 6. Develop a press release as a PSA (Public Service Announcement) that can be used on TV or Radio to get the message out.**



Striving for World Peace Project Five Club Implementation Options



Option I: Provide club presentation on Peace by local club presidents....(Article/PP Available).

Option II: Local clubs implement a peace project that incorporates a fund raising activity, such as a Peace Workshop and/or Dinner with Keynote speaker.

Option III: Distribution of a Peace "Packet" consisting of Peace Book (Let It Begin With Me), 10 page article on Peace, and Peace PowerPoint to another Rotary club with your message.

Option IV: Develop Community alliances and sponsors for a Peace Presentation...possibly a series of newspaper articles from District Peace Article.

Option V: Peace Presentation for Rotary youth organizations, Interact, Rotaract, &/or RYLA



Striving for World Peace Project District Workshop Topics



Group Number 1: Provide a “Peace Tag” for a wheelchair project.

Group Number 2: Develop a Press Release, linking peace to a Rotary Project.

At your club: Develop a peace forum to discuss topics presented at this District symposium.

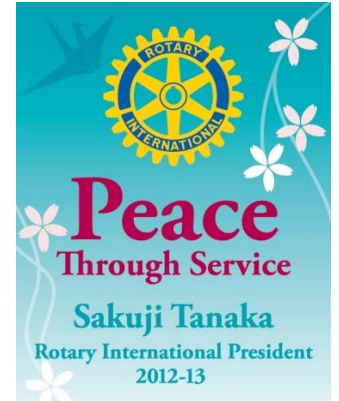
