### **ABOUT 2024-25 DISTRICT GOVERNOR DALE SMITH**



Dale Smith grew up in southeastern Ohio, graduating from Barnesville High School. Dale received a B.Sc. in Ceramic Engineering from the Ohio State University. He has a Six Sigma Black Belt from Sigma Breakthrough Technologies and is facilitator and practitioner of Kepner-Tregoe problem solving and decision analysis. His career began as a process engineer in ceramic tile manufacture and progressed to a very successful career in leading process and quality improvement in manufacturing, including lighting, automotive, building products, label materials and undersea telecommunication systems. Achievements include leading cost projects with significant financial impact including one saving \$2,000,000 per year, solving several "intractable" industry issues, developing and successfully implementing a new manufacturing process for lighting products, leading multiple organizations through the development and certification of quality systems, improving spark plug manufacture to meet the voltage demands of electronic ignitions and other projects that remain proprietary to the organizations involved. Dale retired from Avery Dennison in Mentor, OH in 2021.

Dale's service career began with a brief but impactful stint in town government while residing in Epping, New Hampshire, serving on the planning board and budget committee and as chair of the board of fire wards. He also chaired a new high school site selection committee.

He joined the Rotary Club of Cambridge (OH) in 2003 where he served as Club President in 2005/2006. As Dale's career caused moves around the eastern US, he also was a member of the Downtown Macon (GA), Kent, and Camden (SC) Rotary Clubs.

Dale joined the Mentor Rotary Club in 2014 and served as president of that club in 2019/2020. Dale has served many roles in those clubs including leading many service and matching grant projects while also chairing Literacy, Foundation, and Public Image Committees.

He initiated and facilitated the Lake County Sunrise Satellite Rotary Club and is a member of the District 6630 Membership Steering Committee. Dale was twice named Rotarian of the Year and received a District Service Above Self Award. He is a Paul Harris Fellow +3 and a Bequest Society (Level 4) Member.

In addition to Rotary, Dale served as a director of the Family Counseling Center of Central Georgia. He serves on the Barnesville High School Class of 1979 Scholarship Committee which provides a full scholarship to a single annual graduate of the Barnesville High School who attends one to the top universities in the US.

Dale is married to Jeri Ann, a native of Bath, NY. They reside in Newbury, OH on Raccoon Ridge. Dale is an avid gardener and seasonal winemaker and enjoys daily hikes in retirement with Murphy, Quinn and Keeva - the yellow labs that seem to run the household. Dale and Jeri Ann enjoy travel - especially visiting New York's Finger Lakes.



Scott's bestselling book, "Scare Your Soul: 7 Powerful Principles to Harness Fear and Lead Your Most Courageous Life" (Hachette), available in hardcover, paperback, e-book, and Audible audiobook, has earned a 96% five-star Amazon rating and become a cornerstone resource in the field of personal development and organizational courage-building.



As a sought-after keynote speaker and workshop facilitator, Scott has spoken and catalyzed transformation at Fortune 500 companies and leading organizations including the United Nations Global Compact, Nestle, Cleveland Clinic, Ritz Carlton, Lululemon, and Logitech. His unique approach blends neuroscience, positive psychology, and behavior design to foster workplace courage and innovation.

Scott holds a BA from Skidmore College, MA from Case Western Reserve University, and specialized certificates in Positive Psychology with Harvard professor Tal Ben Shahar and Tiny Habit Behavior Design with Stanford Behavior Design Lab's BJ Fogg.

"We achieve this by providing essential care, redistributing surplus medical supplies, and connecting medically underserved communities with vital resources in Northeast Ohio and around the world. We bridge the gap between the abundance of supplies in the U.S. healthcare system and the inadequate healthcare access experienced by millions of people around the globe and in Ohio.

Further, we provide critical health services and social service navigation to people in our local communities free of charge with no qualifications for care. Our work and mission are unduplicated anywhere in our region and provide a cost-effective, environmentally friendly solution to medical scarcity and barriers to resource access. MedWish International and Medworks recently merged in September 2024.

Britta has been part of the MedWish staff for almost nine years prior to the merge, serving as Executive Director starting in November 2021 and transitioning to CEO of the combined organization this past fall. Prior to becoming the Executive Director, Britta served as MedWish's Director of Business Operations (2015-2018) and Associate Executive Director (2018-2021). While in these prior roles, Britta oversaw MedWish's financials, human resources, gift recording and acknowledgements, international brigades program, grants program, managed the warehouse team and volunteer team, and was also part of strategic planning and major gift planning. As the CEO, Britta oversees MedWish Medworks' merger, strategic direction, and overall operations. In December 2022, Britta was awarded the 2022 Pillar Award for Community Service as 'Nonprofit Executive Director of the Year' from Smart Business.

Before joining the staff, Britta was a volunteer for MedWish, completing internships in 2009 and 2013. Britta has a Master's degree from the University of Kentucky's Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce, with a focus in international development. While at the University of Kentucky she also completed a graduate certificate in global health. She also has a Bachelor's degree in French and Religious Studies from the College of Wooster. While at Wooster she competed for the school's soccer and lacrosse teams, captaining the lacrosse team in her senior year. Britta and her husband have two young children who keep her very active outside of work.
