Applications for District Governor 2016-2017

* The Rotarian must demonstrate willingness, commitment and ability to fulfil the duties and responsibilities of the office of Governor.

 * The Rotarian must have been a member of one or more Clubs for at least seven years.

It is a very import position in the District and all Clubs should look at experienced Past Presidents within their Club. We are hopeful that there will be nominations from all over the District because in recent times there has been a bias towards the western end of the District.

FOUNDATION NEWS December 2013

DISTRICT GRANTS from Paul Harvey, District Grants Sub-committee Chairman

This year \$31,386 was awarded to 20 Clubs for a wide range of Community Projects within District 9820.

The first project completed was by the Rotary Club of Dandenong South East. Their project was a joint venture with Cornerstone-Dandenong where they have been providing helpers to serve meals at the Refuge for the Homeless, and they have, together with Cornerstone, identified 37 people who have been provided with a "Swag". This is a very worthwhile Community Project which was funded from both the Grant and an equal sum provided by the Rotary Club of Dandenong South East.

All Clubs awarded Grants have been requested to provide an up-dated timetable and a brief progress report as all District Grants should, wherever possible, be completed by 30th June, 2014. Payment of the Grants will be made after receiving the completed District Grants Report.

Global Grant in Tonga (GG1416575) PDG Tony Spring

On Sunday 8 September at the Berwick Services Forum I presented a Global Grant opportunity to assist many poor households in three villages in Tonga. The object of the grant was to assist the households create raised vegetable gardens so they could have a regular source of fresh vegetables, increase their nutrition levels and reduce their expenditure on food. Following that meeting I have had 16 Clubs contribute to the Foundation. I would like to sincerely thank the Clubs that have supported Frankston North which are Berwick, Cranbourne, Dandenong, Dromana, Frankston, Frankston Long Island, Frankston Sunrise, Hastings Western Port, Hazelwood, Leongatha, Mornington, Mount Martha, Pakenham, Rosebud Rye and Somerville Tyabb. All up \$19,000 was contributed.

People have the impression that Global Grants are complicated and difficult to do. The Rotary Foundation has provided a step by step series of forms that are completed on-line. It is essential that there is a real need, that the project falls within one of the six areas of focus and that it is sustainable. If it meets all the criteria, and the forms are completely filled out with the appropriate details, then the approval can be given quickly. Following the completion of the forms and gaining all the authorisations, this Global Grant was approved in 7 days.

I look forward to providing regular reports over the next two years on this wonderful project.
