ALTERNATE SCHOOLIES TRIP TO CAMBODIA



The Rotary Club of Frankston Long Island has run an "alternative schoolies" program, taking graduate students on a cultural journey to do volunteer work in Cambodia since 2010. In November 2014, our 5th Schoolies, 10 students from local schools set off on the experience of a lifetime with 4 Team Leaders and 2 Trainee Team Leaders from Peninsula Rotaract Club. Most days in Siem Reap were spent at Krasang Roleung Primary School, where the students taught English in the Grades 4, 5 and 6 classrooms; arts and crafts; and Dental Hygiene to the junior grades and played lots of games with their

new friends in the schoolyard as well as projects at Grace House. The rewards of our "Schoolies" program are immense! Certainly, we make a difference to the lives of the children of Cambodia but we also make a huge difference to the lives of the graduates that accompany us on our trips.
