PARKS, RESERVES & WALKING TRACKS

Newman Park

Peterkin Street, Traralgon.

Within walking distance of the Latrobe Visitor Information Centre, Newman Park appeals to all ages. There is an all abilities swing (Liberty Swing), playground including slides, swings, sandpits, flying fox and much more. Electric BBQ's, park benches, tables and chairs, toilets and ample parking.



Victory Park

Princes Highway, Traralgon (opposite McDonald's).

Enjoy a walk along the Traralgon Creek and admire the marble sculptures "Lars Competalis", by world renowned sculptor Clive Murray-White. Have lunch in the band rotunda, admire the trees and the lovely gardens. Home to the Azarole Hawthorn Tree, the only known example of the species in Victoria. Just a short walk over the foot bridge leads you into Newman Park.



Bert Thompson Reserve

Access and parking available via Wright Street, Traralgon.

Shady grassed areas surrounding two free BBQ's with water tap, four picnic tables, a shaded hut, small rose garden and toilets. A short walk to Victory Park.



Traralgon Railway Reservoir Conservation Reserve

Hickox Street, Traralgon.

Home to 29.5 ha of varied bush and grassland including a lake, information boards and bench seats, native plants and bird life as well as a gravel/boardwalk circuit. Perfect for a stroll on a sunny afternoon. Accessible toilet, wheelchair access is limited around the reserve with gravel paths and boardwalks.



Gippsland Plains Rail Trail

Traralgon-Maffra Road, Traralgon.

The Gippsland Plains Rail Trail extends 63km from Traralgon to Stratford. The trail offers sweeping views of the Great Dividing Range to the north and is unique as visitors can connect to and travel by train to either end of the trail.

Town Walk

Wander past the historical post office and courthouse. Please ask one of our staff or volunteers for a copy of the Traralgon Town Walk.

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ATTRACTIONS

Miniature Steam Train

Peterkin Street, Traralgon

Located in Victory Park the miniature steam train operates on the fourth Sunday of the month (weather permitting) which adults and children can ride on for a gold coin donation. Health Regulations state that NO bare feet, thongs or open toed footwear are permitted on the train.

Lookouts – Loy Yang Mine & Power Station

Jack Vines Lookout (Miners View) and George Bates Lookout (Loy Yang A Power Station), Traralgon Creek Road (C483). Approximately 5km from Traralgon the lookouts provide great views of the open cut coal mine and power station. Open daily 9am – 5pm.

Petersons Lookout

Petersons Lookout is located on road W2 (dirt road) off the Tyers-Walhalla Road. The lookout is open from December to June and offers stunning views overlooking Tyers Gorge and Tyers River.

Note: the sloping gravel walkway leads to timber viewing platforms.

Tyers Lookout

Tyers - Walhalla Road, TYERS (just north of Traralgon)

Extensive views across the Latrobe Valley towards the Strzelecki Ranges. A great view day or night.

Sir Paul Edmund de Strzelecki Monument

515 Princes Highway, Traralgon East

Polish explorer who led an expedition in 1840 through South Eastern Victoria now Gippsland, he named this land after Sir George Gipps (Governor of New South Wales). He also climbed Australia's highest peak and named it Mount Kosciuszko after Polish democratic leader Tadeusz Kosciuszko.
