Fond memories are harbored in my heart about the man from Bow Vallev who became a Congressman and a Governor, serving our great state and nation.

It was my honor to know him personally for more than 60 years.

It was my personal privilege to swear him in as Governor of this state and to administer the Oath of office.

Gov. Thone, a long-time Rotarian, gave definition to the Rotary For Way Test.

For sure, modesty and honesty were Charley's enduring traits.

He realized early on that service to others is both a privilege and an obligation. He taught us how to serve with civility and dignity.

Our departed friend had the capacity to read between the lines, the ability to hear the overtones of truth amidst the noise of falsehood. He had the power to see through the sham, and the grasp of feeling, which binds us to people in need. He also possessed the character which gives stability in every storm and the

courage to have strong convictions.

Here are a few quick examples of what I mean.

Charley always insisted that any good

things that happened on his watch, had to be accorded to others.

I remember that his speech writers were forbidden to ever use the personal pronoun "I."

Any mailings that were laudatory of him, he personally paid for the

postage to be used ... never did the taxpayer pay for that postage.

I remember the first time I sat with him on the Pardon Board. He turned to me and said, "Allen, our first obligation is to seek the truth, be fair to all concerned, and seek to be beneficial to all concerned.'

That was his way of doing things. That's what made Charley Thone such a great inspiration for all of us.

Allen Beermann was Nebraska's longest serving Secretary of State, serving 24 years - from 1971 through 1995.
