Ashland, Nebraska Honors **Bette McCoy**

Bette McCoy makes sure that kids in Ashland don't go hungry. Since 2014, she and other volunteers have opened the Kid's Cupboard

every week to area families. Bette involves and engages area churches with a competition to see which area church can gather the most donations each month. Kid's Cupboard also started a scholarship fund for Ashland-Greenwood seniors who have used the Cupboard's pantry.



Aurora Honors **Taylor Willis**

Taylor Willis and her husband, Andrew, are the first couple you call when you need help in the Aurora community. Besides volunteering

her time to serve on the local museum board, she is on the golf course board and helps with church activities. his parents, Cornhusker Auto Wash. In 2022, the family donated over \$190,000 in cash, services, and sponsorships to their community. Each month they designate four gas pumps at their Shell Gas Station to donate a percentage of all sales to a local nonprofit. They partner with churches in surrounding communities to help support them in hard times, and support RISE, a program that prepares incarcerated individuals for re-integration back into the community. No matter the need, Brian is always there with a solution and a heart to help.



Blair Honors **Ryan Greenwood**

Ryan, a service advisor for Woodhouse Auto Group in Blair, is in his third year as president of The Blair Little League program. Under his leadership the

program has grown to include 294 participants each year. Ryan volunteers countless hours year round seeing to field improvements, scheduling, uniform ordering, pictures and scheduling and hiring of umpires to name a few. Ryan also coaches an in-house team along with running the sister program to Little League the Blair Grizzlies. 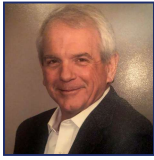


Columbus Morning Honors **Scott Zwick**

Lyn Leach leads the Roughriders Motorcycle Riding Group, an organization raising \$45,000 annually through events and sponsorships. The

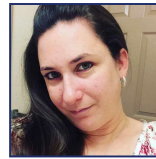

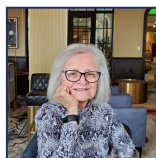
