 - a. Rotary International Terms and Conditions
 - b. Rotary District 5650 additional criteria
 - c. The Mission of The Rotary Foundation
 - d. The number of unique communities / clubs Served
 - e. The extent of financial support by club to The Rotary Foundation
 - f. Local community projects only
 - g. No repeat projects
 - h. Purchase / support of a specific item rather than donation toward large project
