TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR ROTARY FOUNDATION DISTRICT GRANTS

District grants fund small-scale, short-term activities that address needs in your community and communities around the world. These activities align with The Rotary Foundation's mission to help Rotary members advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace by improving health, providing quality education, improving the environment, and alleviating poverty. Districts decide which activities they want to support with district grants.

The Rotary Foundation may modify these terms and conditions at any time to clarify them or to reflect policy changes. Changes made as of January 2022 include:

- · Addition of information about Rotary's youth protection policies (see section I, Eligible Activities)
- Clarification that receipts must be provided for all expenses for grants paid to Argentina and Brazil (see section 8, Reporting Requirements)
- An explanation that interest earned on grant funds must be sent to The Rotary Foundation (see section 9, Canceled Grants)
- Clarification about Rotary's Conflict of Interest Policy for Grants (see section 12, Conflict of Interest Policy for Grants)

1. FLIGIBLE ACTIVITIES



II. ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

All Foundation grant activities need to:

- Relate to the Foundation's mission
- Include active participation from Rotarians
- Exclude The Rotary Foundation or Rotary International from any liability beyond the amount funded by the grant
- Comply with the laws of both the United States and the area where the grant will be carried out and cause no harm. If you sponsor projects in or plan travel to countries sanctioned by the U.S. Treasury Department's Office of Foreign Assets Control, you may need to supply
- Be reviewed and approved by the Foundation before being implemented reimburse clubs or districts for activities and expenses that are in prog encourage you to plan for activities before a grant is approved, but dor to alter a project after a grant is approved, the Foundation also needs t they are carried out.

III. RESTRICTIONS

Grants cannot be used to unfairly discriminate against any group, promote a particular political or religious viewpoint, support purely religious functions, support activities that involve abortion or that are undertaken solely for sex determination, fund the purchase of weapons or ammunition, or serve as a new contribution to the Foundation or to another Foundation grant.

Grants also cannot fund:

- Continuous or excessive support of any one beneficiary, entity, or community
- 2. The establishment of a foundation, permanent trust, or long-term interest-bearing account. Grant funds can be used to establish a microcredit fund if the sponsors comply with the requirements detailed in section X.
- The purchase of land or buildings
- Fundraising activities
- Expenses related to Rotary events such as district conferences, conventions, institutes, anniversary celebrations, or entertainment activities
- Public relations initiatives, unless they are essential to carrying out the project
- Project signs that cost more than \$1,000
- 8. The operating, administrative, or indirect program expenses of another organization, with the exception of expenses allowed within the project management allocation for global grants
- Unrestricted cash donations to a beneficiary or cooperating organization
- 10. Activities for which the cost has already been incurred
- 11. Transportation of vaccines over national borders without prior approval of appropriate government and regulatory authorities in the originating and recipient countries

DISTRICT GRANTS



DISTRICT GRANTS-MATCHING FUNDS 2024-25

Amounts for District Grant Projects



- 1.50:1 Club Contribution / District Match
- Single Club District Grant Projects
 - \$1,500 from club for Maximum Match (Clubs can invest more but the max match will be \$2,250)
 - \$500 Minimum Amount from Club (matched of \$750 to make a \$1,250 project)
- Multi-Club District Grant Projects
 - \$9,000 Maximum Match (Clubs can invest more than \$6,000 but the max match will be \$9,000)
 - at least 4 Clubs must participate in order to receive the maximum match
 - \$2,250 Maximum Match is basis (Clubs can invest more but the max match will be \$2,250)
 - if 3 Clubs, the maximum match would be \$6,750, 2 Clubs, max would be \$4,500
 - No maximum for any club just a maximum for the project
 - \$300 Minimum from any Club



DISTRICT GRANTS – FUNDS REQUESTED

- What if funds requested exceeds funds available?
- Criteria used to select projects may include (not limited to):
 - Multiple applications clubs may be asked to prioritize or reduce the amount of the match
 - New projects may be given priority.
 - The club's 3-year average for per capita giving to the annual fund will be considered



DISTRICT GRANTS

- Local community projects
- Relate to the mission of The Rotary Foundation (TRF)
- Include active participation of Rotarians
 - Not a general donation, capital campaign
 - Pay for specific items after purchase
 - Not able to give a check for periodic future purchases
- Repeat projects may be submitted and will be considered by the District Grant Committee
- Scholarships are ineligible for District Grants



DISTRICT GRANTS – MONEY MANAGEMENT

- MUST use a dedicated bank account for all project funding and expenses
- All project activities, and only project activities, through this account
- Bank statements and check images must be part of project reporting
- Receipts / invoices required for all expenditures prior to payment
- Project expenses may not be incurred before the project is approval by Rotary International



DISTRICT GRANTS – MONEY MANAGEMENT

- Stay ahead of your Financial Reporting Obligations!
 - Upload bank statements as they are received
 - Upload receipts as they are received
 - Label documents so we can recognize what they are (not just Document 1, Document 2, etc.)
 - Create a spreadsheet showing each expense and the check used to pay it

DISTRICT GRANTS – PROJECT TIMELINE

- May 31, 2024 Deadline to submit online applications
- June 2024 District committee reviews project applications, submits Spending Plan to TRF for approval
- July/August 2024 Grant project approval notification; funds received from TRF and disbursed to clubs; projects can begin
- December 31, 2024 Interim report due
- March 31, 2025 Project completion deadline and final report due



PROJECT TIMELINE - OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

- Be sure the everyone understands Rotary's timeframes and requirements.
 - Project expenses cannot be incurred until project is approved by Rotary International.
 - Orders cannot be placed prior to approval.
 - We cannot reimburse for expenses previously incurred.
 - Timeframe for work is basically August through March.
 - Project must follow the approved application changes cannot be made without consideration by the District Grant Committee
 - Reports are due in December and March.



WORKING WITH BENEFICIARY ORGANIZATION

- Items to consider when working with a thirdparty organization:
 - Are you certain the project you are considering is something the organization wants? Perhaps they have another need in mind.
 - Will the project benefit the community at large and not just the organization or a limited segment of the community?
 - As mentioned, be sure the organization understands the timeframes and requirements – does the project fit?




A GLOBAL GRANT MUST:
