Fly into Livingstone and stay for a day or two then travel to the Muzya about 2 hours from Livingstone.

- 6. Travel to nearby Chobe National Park in Botswana where one of the largest elephant populations in the world is seen along with many of the animals for which Africa is so famous
- 7. Drive through Mosi-au-Tuna National Park where you might see a rhino
- 8. Have a 5 star dinner near Victoria falls
