Please note the "**Resources**" **list**, with links, included on page 24 of your GETS Workbook.

- <u>District Governor Basics</u> You should have completed all ten of these courses before GNTS last year. Please review (*or complete*) these courses immediately to ensure that you are shown as "100%" complete (*some courses have been updated in the past year, so you will most likely need to retake portions*).
- <u>District Governor Intermediate</u> There are 11 courses in this second stage of Rotary online DG training, so for this week please complete the <u>Get Ready: District Governor-elect</u> course (*always sign-in to MyRotary.org first*). In this "*Get Ready: DGE*" course you will learn invaluable information about your DGE & DG timelines (*including download Planning Calendars for the next two years*), great ways to get to know your Clubs better, how to set your District Goals to align with Rotary's Action Plan and how to manage District Committee appointments on MyRotary.org. As noted above, this is also where you can download your GETS Participant Workbook.
