CONTRIBUTION DEADLINE

For contributions to be credited for the 2008-2009 Rotary year, they should be sent to the Foundation by early June. The Foundation receives nearly 50% of all contributions in the last two months of the Rotary year. With one million transactions processed annually by the Foundation, it means that nearly 500,000 contributions are processed very late in the year. This can lead to unwarranted mistakes. The Foundation's Reclassification Guidelines allow just 90 days from the date of the gift receipt for corrections to be made. Late contributions can also mean missed recognition opportunities. Please encourage clubs to send accumulated donations now.
