POLIO CHALLENGE UPDATE - As of today \$142 million has been donated to the \$200 million challenge. Clubs are encouraged to contribute a minimum of US \$2000 for each Rotary year of this campaign. Districts are encouraged to contribute at least 20% of their DDF each Rotary year. Certificates of appreciation will be issued to those clubs and districts that meet these goals.



**REMARKABLE POLIO CASE COUNT** - The world has never seen so few polio cases. We are on the threshold of total eradication. This year Nigeria has 6 cases compared to 349 this time last year. India has 24 compared to 152. Cases in non-endemic countries are up - but under control. The battle is not over but the enemy is in retreat. View WHO weekly case count.
