Be sure to check out Rotary International's <u>Global Outlook</u> publication, which emphasizes how the organization can accomplish international goals by connecting people of various nationalities with a common vision. CLUB TREASURER'S MANUAL

Club treasurers now have their own 32 page manual. The manual describes the role and responsibilities of the club treasurer and offers best financial practices from the field. The manual also includes a sample board report, budget worksheet, checklist for treasurers, and worksheets to be used at the district assembly. There is a section on submiting donations to The Rotary Foundation and requesting recognition for the donor. CONTRIBUTION DEADLINES

For contributions to be credited for the 2008-09 Rotary year the donations must be post marked on or before June 30, 2009. Credit Card donations must be received online at Rotary.org or TRFCanada.org and must be authorized prior to midnight, 30 June 2009. (Please keep in mind that gifts received via the web will only benefit the Rotarian who logged in. Reclass and redistribution requests, also known as corrections, cannot be accepted for these gifts.) Reclasses/ Redistributions requests must be received in the TRF Corrections e-mail box prior to 1500 hours on Monday, 6 July 2009. Any contributions received after the dates listed above will be entered for 2009-10. Please remind Rotarians in your club and district to submit their contributions early, allowing 7-10 days for postal delivery.

PHF RECOGNITION POINTS

Effective July 1 2009, the following changes to Paul Harris Fellow Recognition:

- Foundation Recognition Points (FRPs) may only be transferred for transactions of 100 points or more;
- Individual Foundation Recognition Points will expire upon death of the donor or the death of the surviving spouse of a Major Donor (US\$10,000+);
- The individual donor will be the only person authorized to transfer Foundation Recognition Points. If it is a club account then only the Club President may authorize the transfer of points; if it is a district account then the DG may authorize the transfer of points;
- Paul Harris Fellow Medallions will be available for purchase from Rotary's Distribution Center at a cost of US\$15
