RI's investments earned US\$17.0 million, which more than recovered 2009 losses of \$12.1 million. With investment returns of \$92 million, the Foundation recouped more than half of its 2009 losses; its operating reserve is now positive at \$3 million, up from negative \$41 million at the end of June 2009. Operating expenses across the organization are well controlled and remain below budget. <u>read the full report</u>. PILOT AND NON PILOT DISTRICTS WORKING TOGETHER

- Donated DDF is one way pilot and none pilots can work together on a matching grant or global grant. Districts wishing to donate DDF to another district, whether nonpilot or pilot, should contact <u>Steve Lyons</u> for a district-to-district DDF donation form. The simple form has spaces to fill in the recipient district and the dollar amount being donated, and is signed by the



DG and DRFC Chair. The donated funds are not earmarked for any particular project but become part of the receiving district's total available DDF to be used at their discretion. Thus, as with all DDF used in the financing of a Matching Grant or Global Grant, the funds are eligible for a World Fund match for an eligible grant project.
