Rotary Strategic Partnerships







Rotary has reached an agreement with two organizations to form strategic partnerships under The Rotary Foundation's Future Vision Plan: Oikocredit International, a Netherlands-based cooperative financial institution that supports socially responsible investing, and Aga Khan University, a private, nonsectarian university that promotes human welfare and development through research, teaching and community service. The partnership with Aga Khan University will allow Rotary clubs to establish vocational training teams with support from Rotary grants. The teams will enhance the clinical and administrative skills of health educators at the university's campuses in Kenya , Tanzania and Uganda . Through the partnership with Oikocredit, Rotary will offer grants for Rotary clubs to work with microfinance institutions within the Oikocredit network. Together, these institutions and Rotary club members will identify local needs, develop effective approaches and structure training programs to improve entrepreneurs' business skills.



These are the top 10 reasons people support charities. They may not all apply to The Rotary Foundation. However, the number one reason is the same "because you were asked". Have you asked a friend, a Rotarian, a family member, a business colleague, a corporation, a client - to donate to The Rotary Foundation? They will donate if you ask.

Contribution Deadline - For contributions to be credited for the 2010-2011 Rotary year, they should be sent to the Foundation by early June. The Foundation receives nearly 50% of all contributions in the last two months of the Rotary year. With one million transactions processed annually by the Foundation, it means that nearly 500,000 contributions are processed very late in the year. This can lead to unwarranted mistakes. The Foundation's Reclassification Guidelines allow just 90 days from the



date of the gift receipt for corrections to be made. Late contributions can also mean missed recognition opportunities. Please encourage clubs to send accumulated donations now.

Communities in Action: A Guide to Effective Projects was developed to provide Rotary clubs with the tools they need to plan, implement, and evaluate effective service projects. The methods described in this guide have been chosen from techniques commonly used by Rotary clubs and community development experts around the world. Rotary clubs can adapt these methods to the
