2 for 1 PHF Points - Foundation General Manager John Osterlund has some good news to share with us about the preliminary results from our World Polio Day on-line giving promotion. 2-for-1 Paul Harris recognition points were offered for individual on-line donations for Polio eradication. At least 1600 Rotarians registered on the Member Access Portal (MAP) for the first time. Rotarians in more than 60 countries contributed on-line. The average gift was over US\$300. Total Polio contributions received on-line in one week were over US\$2.8 million. The TRF Canada online donation website received 4 times the number of visits to the site during the 2 for 1 offer and more than 800 donations were made on the TRF Canada site.

What are Foundation Recognition Points (FRPs)? FRPs are contribution credits that can be transferred from one Rotary account to another.
