EREY - A CONTINUING SUCCESS STORY

Since its inception in Rotary year 03-04 – our Every Rotarian Every Year campaign has had a string of successes. Average per capita giving around the globe has risen from \$58 that year to \$95 dollars last year. Total annual giving increased from \$70 million the first year to \$113 million last year or more than 60%, in just 5 years! Which means that we will be able to do 60% more in three years time than we could 2 years ago. Doing 60% more good in the world in just 5 years! Zone 22 has very much been a part of this success. Most Districts have already achieved the minimum average of \$100 per capita and several will go over \$200 per capita. D5040 went over \$190 in 2007-08. NOVEMBER IS FOUNDATION MONTH

November is just around the corner. A good time to remind Rotary Clubs to make sure that they include the Foundation in their weekly programs in November. \$30 MILLION FOR POLIO

The Government of Canada has announced \$30 million to help immunize children in sub-Saharan Africa of which at least \$15 million will go to Nigeria, where polio is still endemic. This commitment is in addition to \$60 million announced in June of this year towards projects to help eradicate polio in Kandahar and throughout Afghanistan. Read more English or Français.



GSE DEADLINE - Oct 1st

October 1st is the deadline for districts to submit planned district partnerships to TRF. If your district is still searching for a partner go to the Member Access site on the RI web site and look for the GSE Resource Forum – you will find other districts looking for a match. DGE's, GSE committee chairs and DRFC's are able to access the GSE Forum.

Districts are encouraged to consider single vocational teams — teams where the members share a profession, interest or skill set. This approach can lead to a powerful exchange as the vocational aspects can be focused — bringing more benefits to the host district and for the visiting teams. D7070 has done this in recent years, sending an AIDs related team to Africa and a public service team from Ontario with a medical team from Eastern Russia. Review the revised Program Guide as there are a number of important changes, including a requirement to submit the team leader and member applications to TRF electronically. Read more.
