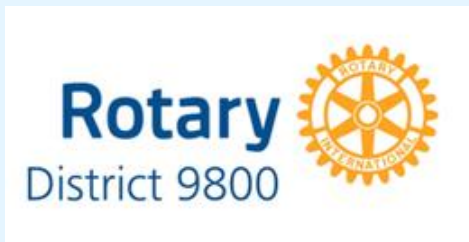


THE ROTARY LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE COURSE

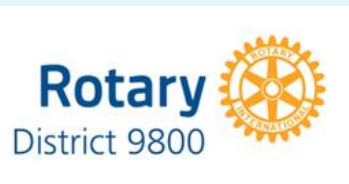

The History and Future of Rotary

Rotary started with the vision of one man — Paul Harris.

On 23 February 1905, Paul Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. This was the first Rotary club meeting.



The first four Rotarians (from left): Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, Hiram Shorey and Paul P. Harris, circa 1905-12.

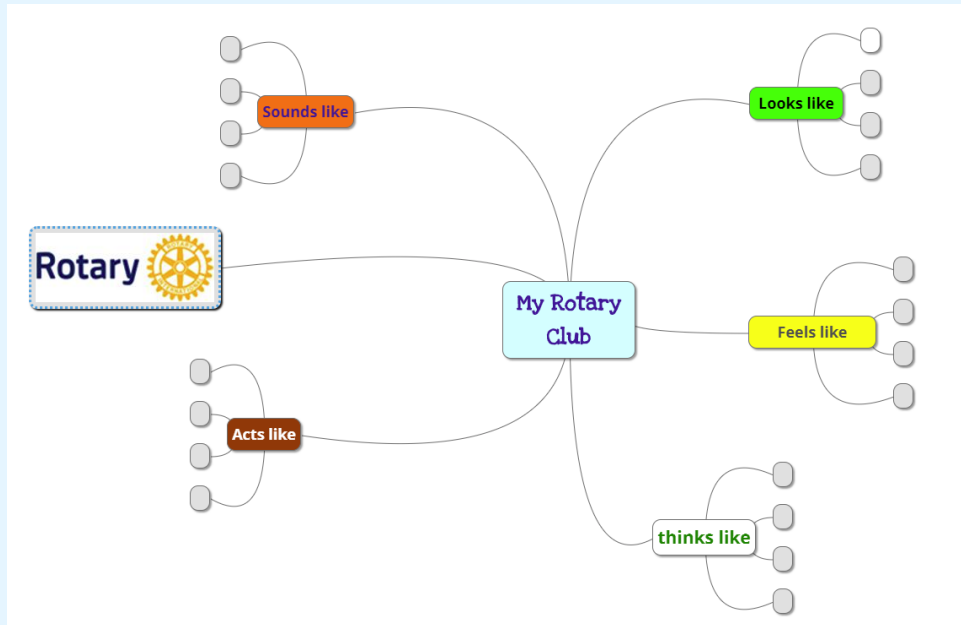

Creating a Vision

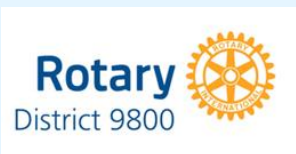

Planning for the future

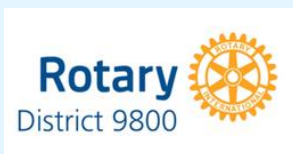
Strategic planning in Rotary occurs when Rotarians use an agreed vision to co-operatively and collaboratively plan and document a future for themselves.

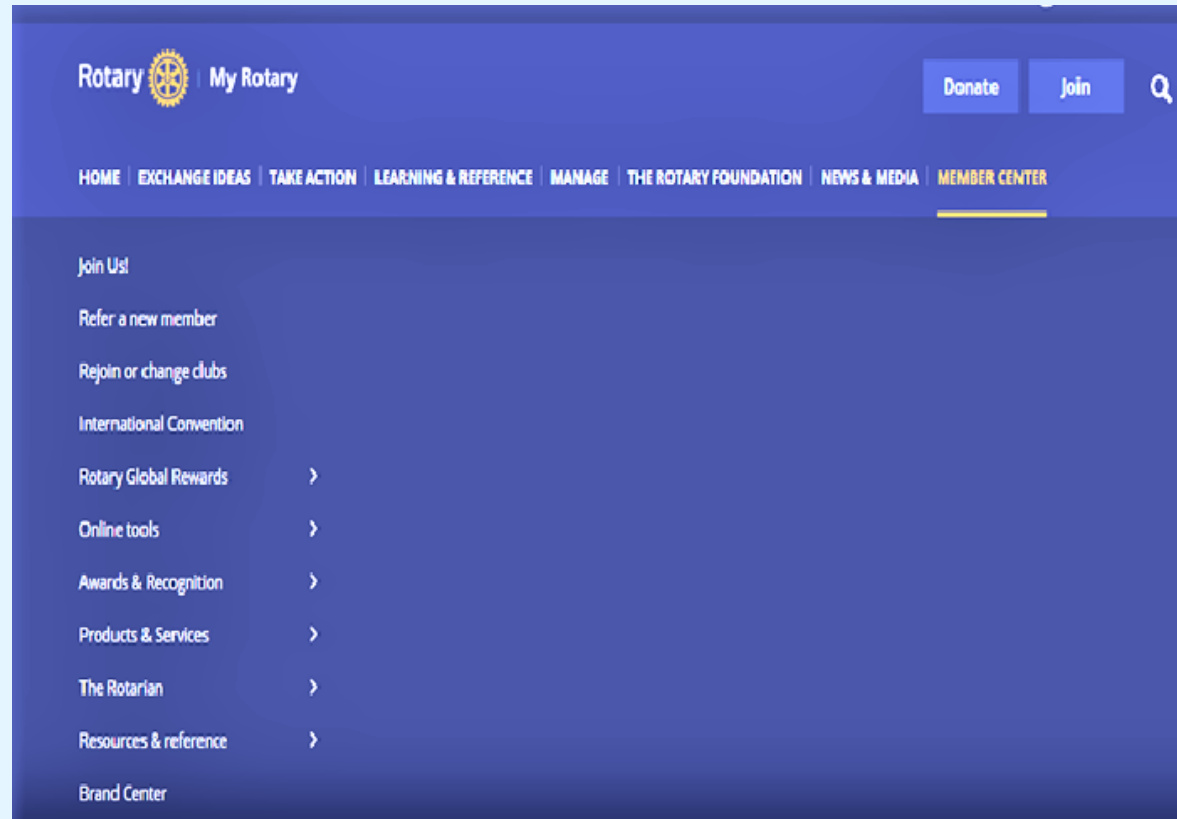
