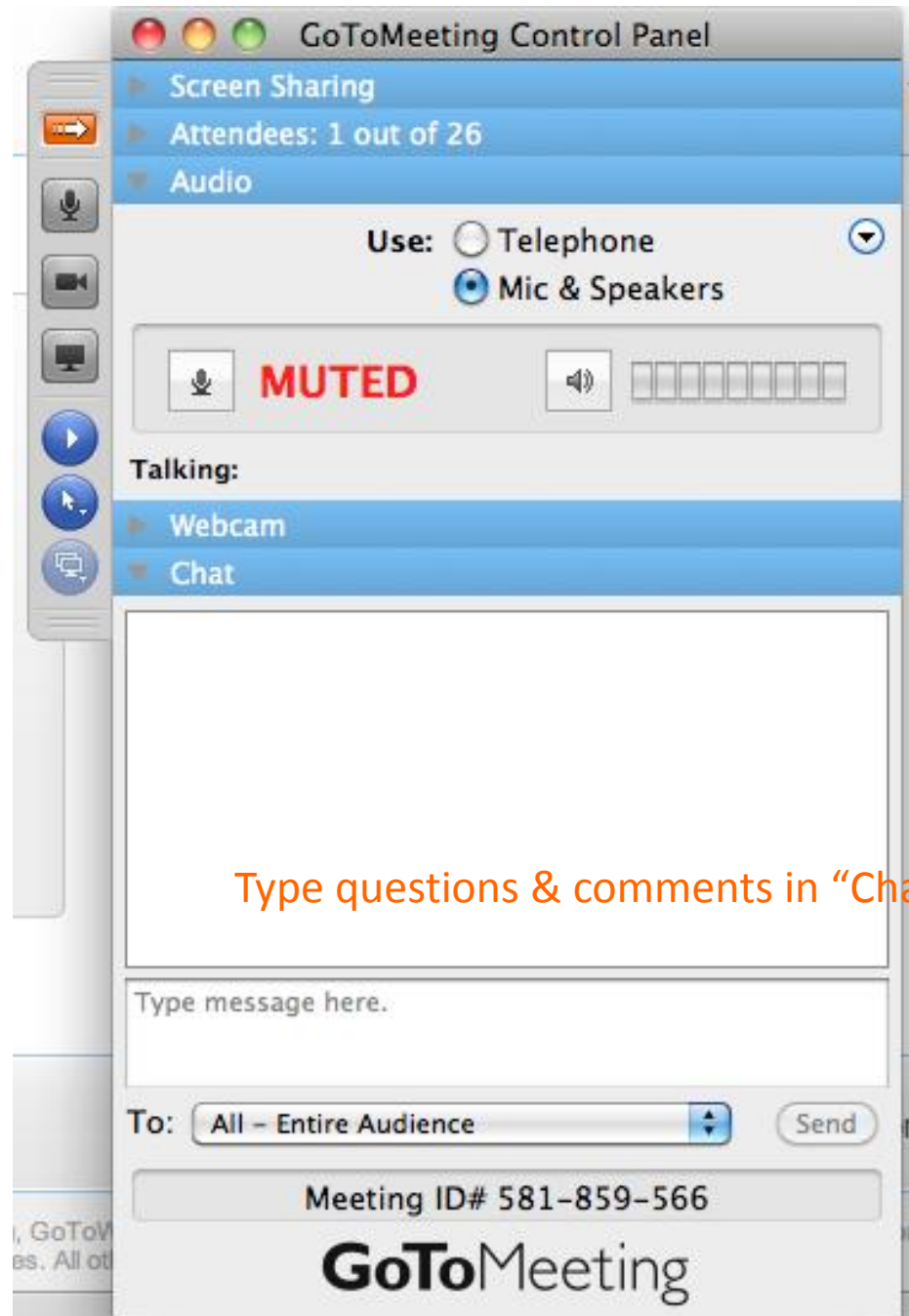

## **Addendum to Club MOU**

***In order to receive any type of grant from District 7890 the Club must be qualified. Qualifiers:***

- Attendance at a 2014-2015 District Grant Management Seminar by two club members
- Submit the club's 2015-16 Foundation Goals into Club Central on rotary.org by May 1, 2015
- Club and/or club members make a contribution to the SHARE/Annual Fund by May 1, 2015,
- Presidents for 2015-16 and presidents for 2016-2017 signing both the *Club MOU* & *Addendum to Club MOU*

# Stewardship

• **Stewardship is the responsible management and oversight of grant funds, including:**

- Rotarian supervision
- Financial records review
- Oversight of funds
- Reporting irregularities
- Timely submission of reports





# Document Retention

- Provide access
- Retain for a minimum of five years
- Make copies



# Stewardship

**A donor who understands that funds were used in an appropriate and responsible manner is more likely to give to the Foundation again to support projects.**

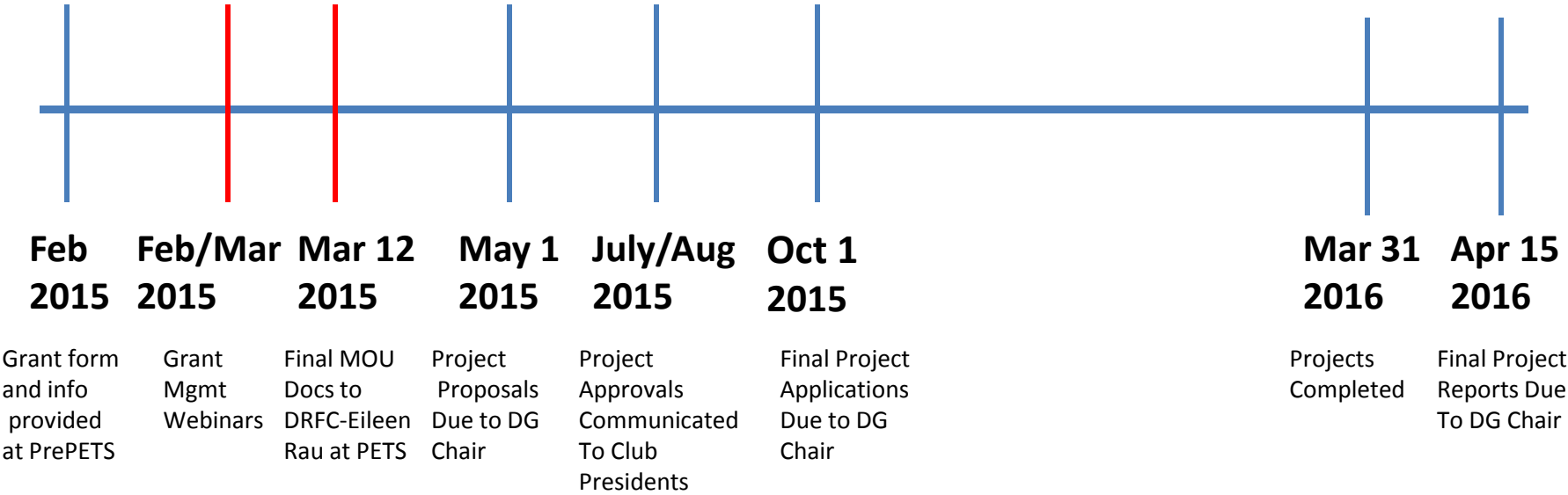
