

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDER Paul P. Harris 1868-1947

"Rotary is a miniature model of a world at peace, one which might advantageously be studied by nations. Rotarians believe that the universal application of tolerance and friendliness would bring about the international peace earnestly desired by everyone".

Paul Harris was born in Racine, Wisconsin, USA on April 19, 1868. Raised in Vermont by

his grandparents, he received the Bachelor of Physical Culture and LLD degree from the University of Vermont. He later earned the LLB degree from the University of Iowa. He received an honorary Ph.D. from the University of Vermont in 1933.

During his early years, Paul Harris worked as a cowboy, newspaper reporter, stock company actor and as a college teacher. He later was a salesman for marble and granite, which gave him the opportunity to travel around the United States and Europe.

In 1896, Paul Harris decided to go to Chicago to practice law. One evening, during an after-dinner walk through a residential section with a fellow lawyer, Harris was impressed that his friend knew and introduced him to the proprietors of several stores and shops. Still feeling alone in such a large city as Chicago – probably because of his Vermont upbringing – the experience caused Harris to think about making social friends among his law clients.

On February 23, 1905, Paul Harris formed a club to band together representative business and professional men in friendship and fellowship. That day marks the date when the nucleus was formed for what is today an organization of over 34,000 Rotary Clubs and 1.2 million members from nearly 200 countries around the world!

While Paul Harris devoted much of his time to Rotary, he also found time for other civic and professional work. He was first Chairman of the Board of the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults in the USA and of the International Society of Crippled Children. He was member of the board of the Chicago Bar Association and its representative at the International Congress of Law at The Hague, as well as a member of the American Bar Association. The Boy Scouts of America awarded him with the Silver Buffalo Award; in addition, numerous governments and organizations throughout the world decorated him.

He is a recipient of the RI Service Above Self Award and a Presidential Citation, and The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award.

R.I. President, Gary C.K. Huang

I find many traditional Chinese values reflected in Rotary: values of service and responsibility, of respect for family and for others. Sometimes I call Confucius the world's first Rotarian, because even though he died 2,500 years before Rotary was founded, his ideas are very much Rotary ideas. And one of the things he said was: 與其抱怨, 不如改變.

In English, you say, "It is better to light a single candle than to sit and curse the darkness."

I think that one line sums up the way we in Rotary approach the problems of the world. There is so much difficulty. There are so many people who need help. Many people look at this and say, "There is nothing I can do." So they do nothing – and nothing changes.

But this is not the Rotary way. The Rotary way is to light a candle. I light one candle, you light one candle – and so do 1.2 million other Rotarians. Together, we can do so much more than we could ever do alone. Together, we can light up the world. In 2014-15, I am asking each of you to light your own Rotary candle – and *Light Up Rotary together*.

There are so many ways to Light Up Rotary. I hope many of you will choose to host a Rotary Day, to show your community what Rotary is and what we do. I hope you will involve your Rotaract and Interact clubs in your service, to bring the new generation of the Rotary family closer to Rotary membership. And I hope you will keep Rotary strong by inviting new members into Rotary – including your own spouses and family. Perhaps the most important thing we can do to *Light Up Rotary together* is to finish the job we've been working on for more than a quarter of a

century: the eradication of polio. We are so close to our goal. But we will get there only if we keep up the fight, keep up the momentum, and close the funding gap for the polio endgame plan.

Light Up Rotary together is our theme for this year, but it is more than just a theme. It is how we in Rotary see the world and our role in it. We believe that no one should sit alone in the darkness. Instead, we can come together, all 1.2 million of us, to Light Up Rotary. This is our goal – and my challenge to you.

2014-2015 Presidential Citation Light up Rotary

The Presidential Citation recognizes Rotary clubs for achieving an array of accomplishments that help them become stronger, deliver more effective service, and enhance their public image. By qualifying for the Presidential Citation, clubs contribute to Rotary's organizational goals and multiply the impact of their good work through the collective focus of 34,000 Rotary clubs worldwide.

Procedure

Clubs are asked to complete the following form to assess their accomplishments this year. https://www.rotary.org/myrotary/en/document/10 2656

In order to qualify for a citation, clubs must meet the Presidential Challenge and complete one required activity, along with at least three additional activities, in each of the three categories listed. Unless otherwise specified, all activities must be undertaken and completed between 1 July and 31 March of the 2014-2015 Rotary year. Clubs should complete the form and send it to the district governor no later than **31 March**. *Forms sent to Rotary International will not be processed*. District governors must report the names of their qualifying clubs through Member Access no later than

15 April.

Rotary Code of Conduct

As a Rotarian, I will

- 1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behaviors and activities
- 2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve in Rotary
- 3. Conduct all of my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others
- 4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings
- 5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society
- 6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community
- 7. Honor the trust that Rotary and Fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians
- 8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship



Rotary's Wheel Emblem And the "Woodruff Key"

A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. Rotarian Montague Gear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion, made the first design. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement." Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads. Finally, in 1922, it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. Thus, in 1923, the "Rotary International Association" adopted the present gear wheel with 24 cogs and six spokes. A group of engineers advised that the gear wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the keyway was added and the design that we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.

What is the "**Woodruff Key**?" Frank H. Throop, former editor of the Marshall MN Rotary Club, says, "Look at the Rotary wheel emblem, and you will note a small slot at the top of the center circle. The Woodruff Key, a half-round piece of steel, fits into the slot to secure the wheel to the shaft, securing the wheel for motion" "All Rotarians are symbolic Woodruff Keys," Frank points out, "holding the wheel of the club to the shaft of Rotary International, to keep this great organization turning.
