








1985 350,000








how did the three endemic countries go in 2013?

- great progress in Nigeria ↓□ 50%!
- and Afghanistan $\downarrow 67\%!!$
- not so great in Pakistan 1 9%.
- **overall** − **↓ 36%** to just **160** cases.







how about other countries in 2013?

- Syria
 - $-Zero \rightarrow 26$ **cases** (Pakistan strain)
 - huge population movement.
- Horn of Africa (Somalia, Ethiopia, Kenya)
 - $Zero \rightarrow 217$ **cases** (Nigeria strain)
 - over half the world's total.
- Worldwide (endemic & other)

- 183% 223 → 407.

what is going on in Pakistan??

- disease has never been stopped there

 it remains endemic.
- major problems:
 - **geography** for team access.
 - **assassinations** of polio workers.
 - **political independence** in some areas.
 - **cultural** diversity.
 - mistrust of West.
- **exporting** the disease.







Peshawar & North Waziristan

"The densely populated **Peshawar** valley is considered to be the main 'engine' of poliovirus transmission"

North Waziristan —

"largest number of children being paralyzed by poliovirus in the world...

Immunization activities have been **suspended** by local leaders since **June 2012**."





what is the solution in Pakistan?



nobody wants their kids paralysed.

this situation is not new

these problems have been solved before

openness and tenacity.





key role played by women

"With the ability to speak woman to woman, they can show that they are willing to have their own children vaccinated".

meanwhile...

- critical to keep immunising everywhere.
- there are virtually **NO savings** in program costs, despite small number of cases.
- this would be EXACTLY the wrong time to relax.





situation summary

- eradication remains daunting
 - fighting on so many fronts!
- 'containing' virus NOT an option
 - will just explode again.
 - lives lost or ruined
 - **\$40–50 billion** benefits lost.
 - all that effort... for nothing.
- finishing job the only option."
