I was reminded of this at the opening of RYLA with my Youth Chair Jade, RYLA Chair Tony and his team, "Mum and Dad" David and Di, and the Director Erin and all her team putting in endless hours to make the week a success for the RYLarians your clubs have sponsored. Oh, and all the Rotarians from those clubs who have interviewed, selected, fund raised and transported those young adults to and from Vision Valley (including two from Timor Leste). Enormous amounts of just bloody hard work and worries over 12 months to make this RYLA as successful as its predecessors.

Is all that bloody hard work worthwhile? YOU BETCHA!! Let me give a few current examples:

1. Obviously, those RYLarians will go back to their groups and communities energized like Duracell bunnies, better equipped for their future;
2. We will have six more Rotary Youth Exchange Students than last year;
3. My AGs told me that it was necessary to educate the "P-train" (that is, those with potential to be Club Presidents) resulting in the DAC approving additional Training Funding to meet \$50 of the cost of any developmental course (including Rotary Leadership Institute and Toastmasters);
4. Our membership is slowing growing – one of only four Districts in Australia to buck the downward trend;
5. Your District Conference is already at break even point, so we can keep the registration cost down to the early bird price (as long as you register by 14 February) – sponsorship on board from Subaru, who are looking at a long term relationship – a program to knock your socks off; [Register Now!](#)
6. Your District is always near the top for giving to Australian Rotary Health (\$221,000 to November) and ShelterBox;
7. RYLA in Timor Leste sponsored by Woodside and its partners, realising the great benefits of leadership training in that young country;
8. A growing association with Macquarie University and its social development programs;
9. Within the Foundation, great things (for detail see [Tony's newsletter](#)) including:
 - a. Donations up 12% for the Annual Fund and 10.6% for End Polio Now compared to same period last year;
 - b. Fantastic GSE team to Turkey of four selected (from a strong field of nine) and programs set in place for the team from Turkey (who you can meet at the Conference);
 - c. Seven Simplified Grants for Club projects approved of \$16,800 (out a budget of \$22,400);

d. Nine Matching Grants approved for projects totaling over \$250,000;

e. A Special Initiative Grant approved for \$11,000 to help send a Legal Team from Sydney University to help Myanmar (Burma) set up its democratic institutions;

f. Reports back from our current four Ambassadorial Scholars at Harvard University, Cambridge University, London School of Economics and University of Geneva.

10. At the Council of Governors in November, I was pleased to get through:

a. Resolution of a Probus issue which has been around for at least three years;

b. An initiative that has the potential to save thousands of dollars on our insurance premiums;

c. An initiative to get some long term, Australia wide marketing of Rotary through RDU;

AND, that's before we get back to our 67 Clubs, where the real hard work is done and local and international results achieved! Recently, that has included support from our Clubs for the bushfire stricken areas of Tasmania and NSW through the Rotary Districts affected.

On going through my diary, I've been to over 100 meetings, events and functions across the District in my first six months. I've had Rotary on my mind, computer screen or telephone almost every day. I feel that we have achieved a lot so far and the hard work has been well worth the effort.

Thanks for the nice feedbacks on my "John Lennon" Christmas newsletter. I followed my suggestion and had two weeks of do-nothing bliss up the coast with Janelle and the family. With batteries recharged, I'm looking forward to my next/last six months as Governor.

Relief Funds Able To Collect Tax Deductible Donations for Tasmanian Bushfires

The Australian Government will provide tax deductible status to relief funds established to help Australians affected by the Tasmanian bushfires. The Acting Assistant Treasurer, the Hon Gary Gray AO, MP, today declared the January 2013 Tasmanian fires a disaster for the purposes of establishing Australian disaster relief funds. Donations to Australian disaster relief funds, established to provide relief in the aftermath of the bushfires, will be tax deductible for a period of two years from the date of this declaration.

Coonabarabran bushfires

"Thank you to all the people who have been in contact with us expressing concern about the effects of the fires in the Coonabarabran area. To date (Mon 14 January), 33 homes have been confirmed as lost, plus over 50 sheds, with equipment and vehicles, fencing, and large numbers of stock. Most of the homes belong to people who are friends of the members of the Rotary Club of Coonabarabran. The homes of members have been threatened, and several have lost sheds and tractors, but so far no member has lost their home." An extract from PDG Jo Wilkin's report.

According to DG Brian Beesley on the [District 9650 website](#), the best assistance is financial. The District has a disaster account already established for this purpose so they can assist those in need appropriately. Bank account details are on their website.

Similarly, the Rotary Club of Coonabarabran has opened a special account to assist. Details of the District and club accounts is on the [club's website](#). Follow the club's [Facebook site here](#).

At this stage, there is no requirement for goods of any kind, including blankets and furniture.


ShelterBox on the ground in Tasmania

"On entering the area, we witnessed the indiscriminate path of the fire noting that some areas of bush land and pastoral fields have been left untouched," said Scott. 'But houses centered in the fields have been destroyed by embers reported as travelling some 15 kilometres and igniting on impact."

Dunalley is said to be the worst affected area in Australia's southern state. Australian SRT members and Rotarians Greg Moran, Scott Jarman and Lynn Jarman are working with local Government and Tasmania's State Emergency Service to assess the need and assist an estimated 150 households who have lost everything.

Engage Rotary, Change Lives in 2013-14



Get the most from social media

Maximize your online presence

Here's how a little planning and know-how will help you get the most from social media

Are you looking for younger members? Do you need volunteers for your signature project? Are you missing money for fuel? A single one-page digital strategy can help you focus your goals.

Your strategy should include your target audience and the types of media that will help you achieve your objectives. If you don't have a website, consider starting there. Facebook and LinkedIn can help you learn what's important to your audience, while Twitter and Pinterest offer additional avenues for sharing club information.

What should be on your club website?

Show how your club benefits the community and why it's worth joining by posting photos and information about your service projects and social events. Indicate where and when the club meets, along with contact information. Keep the information as up-to-date as possible.

"Your website says a lot about your club. Make it clear, organized, and simple to understand," says Chad Wilks, a pastor from the 11 website *Maximize Your Online Presence* and president of the Rotary Club of Lee's Summit-Suffice in Missouri, USA.

What should be on your social media pages?

"To be effective, you need to be social. Share information that interests others. Visit your audience's pages and engage with them there," says Sharon Chen Collins, another website pastor and a charter member of the *Rotarians on Social Networks* Fellowship.

To reach a wide audience, create a Facebook page, not a profile or group. Use names to draw short — 140 characters, to be exact — messages about your club activities. Post photos that tell a story on Instagram and Pinterest.

"You only get a few seconds to get your message across," says Wilks. So make sure your message is achieving your goals.

The **Centurion program** is the Australian program that helps individuals to actively support the great work the Foundation does. It gives Rotarians, friends and family, an opportunity for individual giving of a **tax deductible** donation of \$100 for as long as you choose.

Yes, the Centurion Plan allows Rotarians to claim a donation to the Foundation as a tax deduction. You will receive a receipt from the Australian Rotary Foundation Trust. And you make an annual decision whether you can continue to support the program.. It's

amazing what your \$100 (the cost of just one cup of coffee a fortnight) can achieve.

What happens to the money? Your contribution becomes part of the District Annual Giving Program which means half your \$100 comes back to support District Foundation programs that support our clubs. It also counts towards a Paul Harris Fellowship.

New Centurions receive a Centurion badge when they join and renewal reminders are sent out at the start of the new financial year. You can join at any time.
