On Friday 8 February was the [Rotary Youth Exchange Welcome home dinner](#), splendidly organized by Carlingford Club and with about 170 in attendance. Lots of opportunities to catch up with Clubs involved in Youth Exchange and amazing to see all those Inbound and Rebound Students all dressed up. I reckon I saw some of the highest heels imaginable!

February 9 was the inaugural [Paul Harris Society Dinner](#) at the Epping Club. The concept was to celebrate those Major Donors and Paul Harris Society members who make a significant contribution to the Rotary Foundation. As luck would have it, the Trustees of the Australian Rotary Foundation were meeting in Sydney the next day and so could attend, together with the guest speaker Foundation Trustee Ian Riesley. The evening was arranged by Margaret Dean of St Ives Club and was a great success. PDG Monica Saville (Epping) as Zone Foundation Chair led the evening and we even had Geoff Little (E-Club of Greater Sydney) JOIN the Paul Harris Society on the night!

I could take pages to extol the virtues of our **Rotary Foundation**, but enough for me that there are now only three Polio endemic countries and only one reported case this year. India has been polio free for TWO years. When Janelle and I joined the Rotary family, there were 1,000 new cases every day.

You don't get a break on Sundays in this job and the morning of February 10 was spent starting the process of **nominating our DG for 2015-16**. The committee met under the chair of PDG George Papallo and set the guidelines and timetable for the selection procedure. Past Presidents with five years service in Rotary should consider putting themselves forward for the most tiring, invigorating, inspiring, exasperating, fascinating job in Rotary. If you want to discover how much good there is in the world and meet lots of great people, this is the job!

Monday night was up at **Gosford North Club** for their awards night. In addition to the three PHFs being presented, I was able to present Bob Fraser with a Service Above Self Award from RI President Sakuji Tanaka. There are only 150 of these awarded across the Rotary world in any one year and Bob was a deserving recipient after his 44 years of Rotary service, particularly using his architectural skills both locally and overseas. Bob is the fifteenth Rotarian of this District to be so recognized since the awards were instituted in 1991.

Yesterday was another big day, and I wasn't even there for the event. After 9 months of haggling, drafting, politicking and explaining, the **Probus South Pacific** Limited Board resolved to amend its Constitution to become a much more democratic organization. The Probus people have been terrific; PDG Jennifer Scott has worked hard; the RDU Board has cooperated; many Probians have expressed their views strongly; and the Council of Governors has acted appropriately. Change does not happen without some pain and controversy. I sincerely feel that Rotary can be proud that it has left Probus to be run by ITS members, but with plenty of continuing Rotary involvement.

Rotarians of the soon to be formed District 9685, comprising all of District 9680 and the twelve designated clubs from current District 9690 are invited to apply for the position of District 9685 Governor for the years 2015-16.

As a minimum requirement, all applicants must:

- Be of good standing and financial members of their Club
- Have served for a full term as President of a Rotary Club or as specified in the 2010 Manual of Procedure p28
- By 1 July 2015 have completed seven years of membership with one or more Rotary Clubs.

Candidates are advised to refer to the detailed requirements of the responsibilities and roles of the District Governor, District Governor Elect and District Governor Nominee in the Manual of Procedure pp 28-33. The 2010 Manual of Procedure is available on the RI Website [at this link](#).

Application for District Governor is to be made through your Club President from an application which has been emailed both to the Club President and the Club Secretary. It may also be downloaded from the District 9680/5 website at rotarydistrict9685.org.au


Completed and signed applications are to be lodged with PDG George Papallo either by email georgepapallo@bigpond.com or by mail to 3/26-30 Merriwa Street Gordon NSW 2072 as soon as possible to give the applicant as much time as possible to complete the required items. On receipt of your application, a District Governor Nomination Pack will be sent to you to prepare you for your interview and the selection process. Applicants will be required to submit:

1. A personal CV
2. A Rotary CV
3. Written answers to a number of Rotary issues relevant to your role as District Governor

These responses must be returned to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee, PDG George Papallo by the closing date, Monday, 8 April 2013.

Applicants will be required to attend an interview with the Nominating Committee at the Rotary D9680 office, 7 Sefton Road, Thornleigh on Sunday 21 April, 2013. The time of the interview will be advised.

- expects Woodside and its Joint Venture Partners - Shell, Osaka Gas and Konico Philips - to again sponsor RYLA in East Timor and also RYPEN.
- is continuing Biblioteka Literacy efforts
- is taking initiatives with supplying health equipment
- is doing the groundwork towards initiating a Toilets in Schools project with Chatswood
- in conjunction with Macquarie University, provided funds for young East Timorese to attend the Diplomacy Training Program in Dili last November.


