- Then President Arch C.
   Klumph proposed to set up an endowment in 1917
- The first contribution to the endowment was from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, USA for \$26.50.
- The endowment is the precursor to The Rotary
   Foundation, the not-for-profit philanthropic organization that supports Rotary International.










#### Personal Giving v Other Giving By Country Group.














#### Where the money went in 2013-14
